The bond between the teacher and the taught shall last forever through respectful celebration of the "Teachers Day," which marks the birthday of Bharat Ratna philosopher and educationist Dr. S.Radha Krishnan, former President of India.

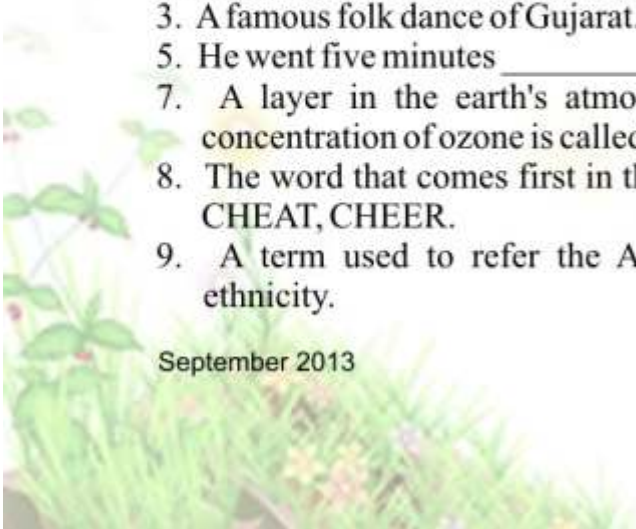

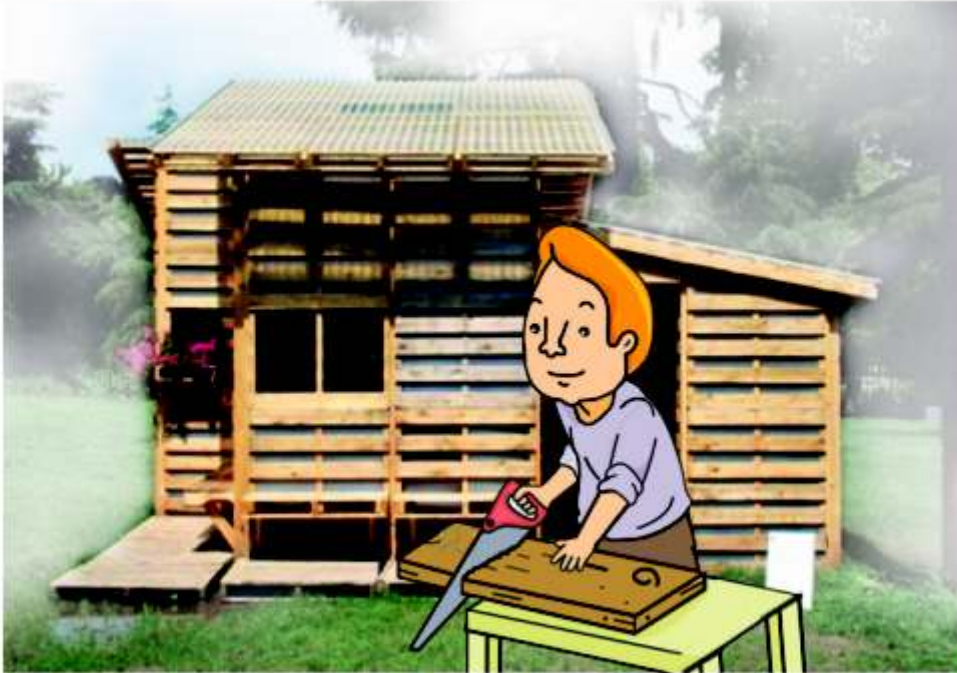

That wash away the drains

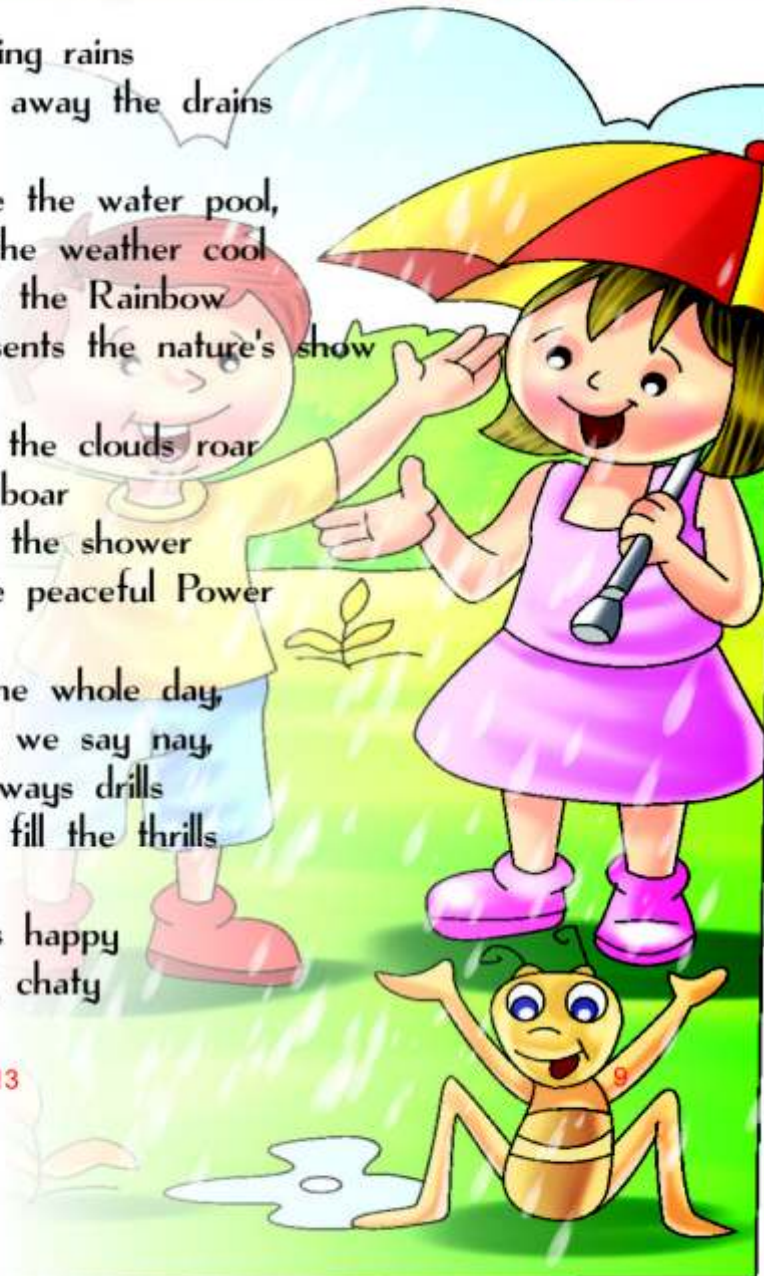

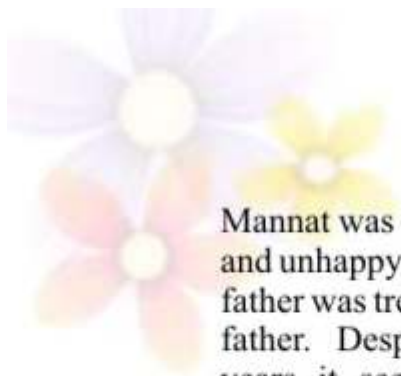
Is it really so?

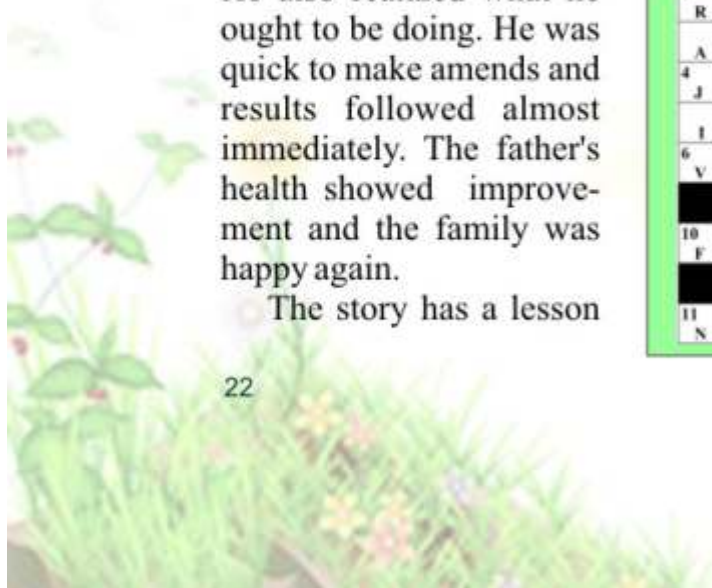
The story has a lesson

We must, therefore, always behave well, lest we should have to hang our head down in shame. ●

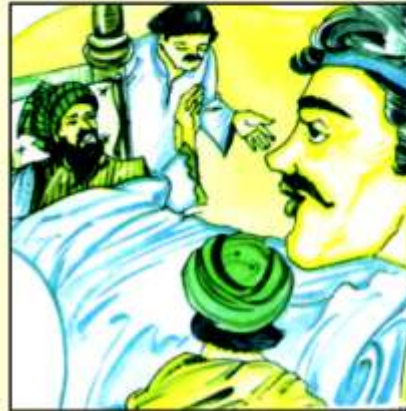
Story- **Don't

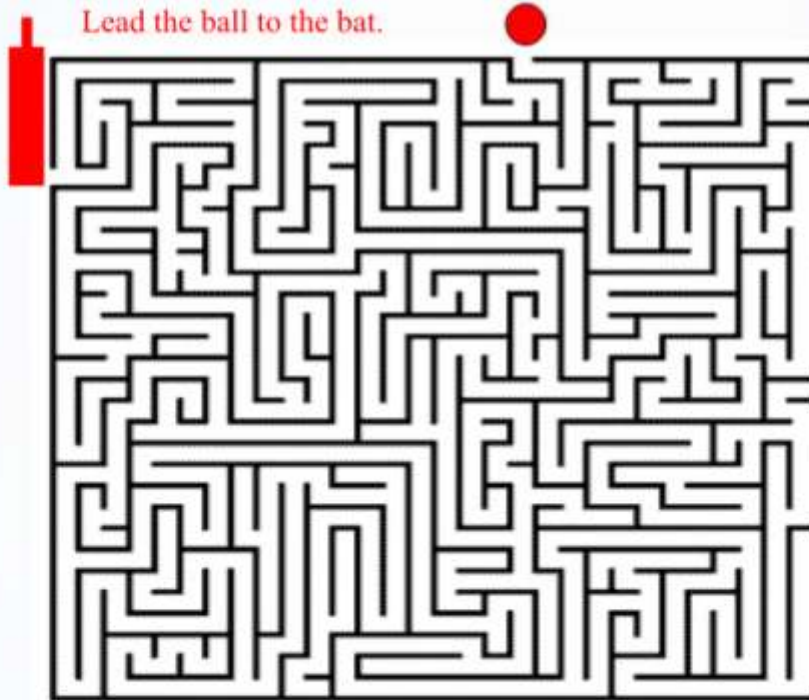

The Scientists are now on the look out for finding out ways and means of survival of mankind.



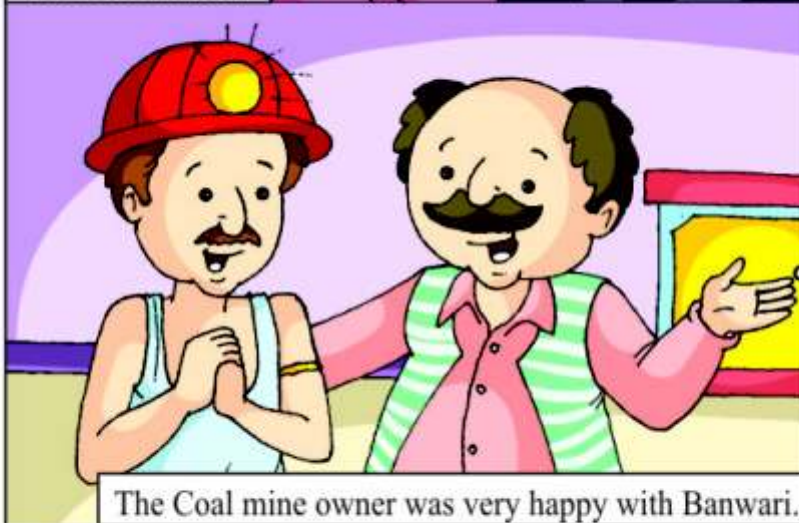

One of them was Banwari, who used to work with lot of hard work and dedication.



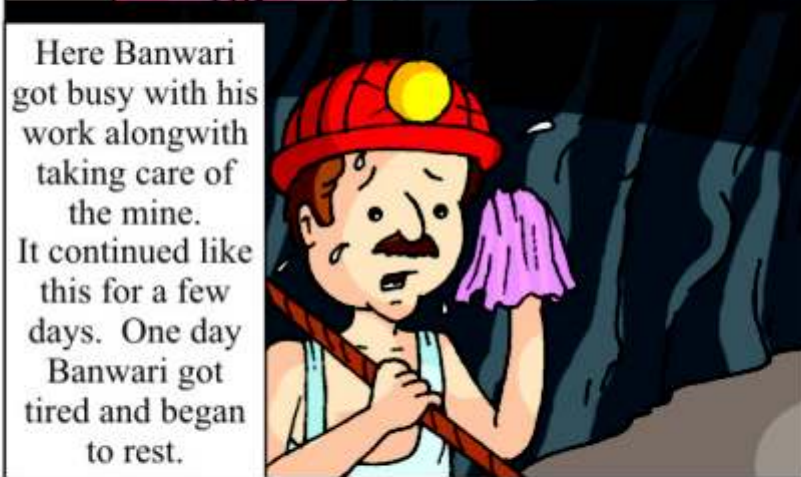
The Coal mine owner was very happy with Banwari.

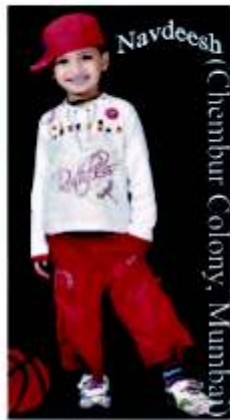

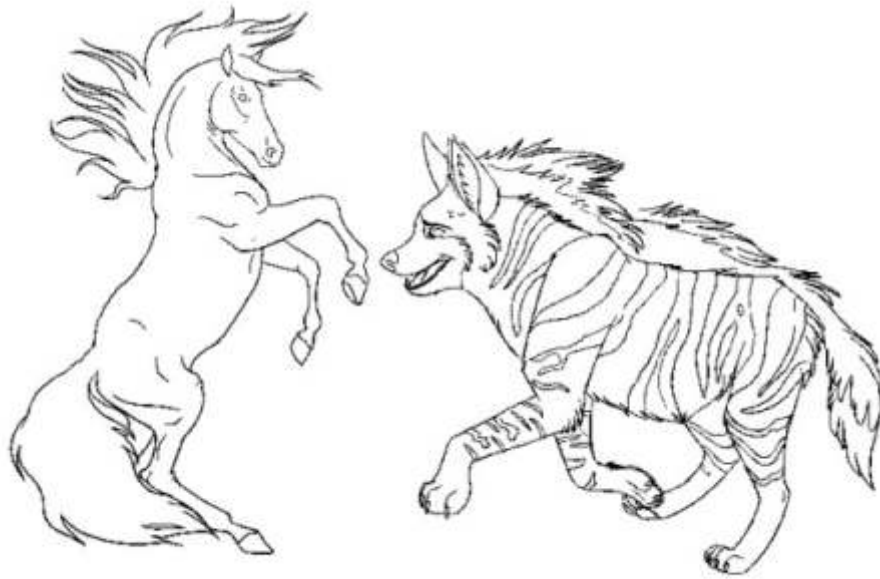
