Merges in Nirankar

Dharam Ratan awardee Her Holiness Nirankari Rajmata Kulwant Kaur Ji merged into Formless God on August 29th 2014 at 20:35. Rajmata ji was 84 years of age. She was the mother of His Holiness Nirankari Baba Hardev Singh Ji Maharaj.

Since her childhood, Rajmata Ji had an avid interest in matters of spirituality and had a deep understanding of religious scriptures and writings. Rajmata Ji was fortunate



enough to have the *Darshan* of Baba Buta Singh Ji and thereafter received *Bhram Gyan* from *Yugpuru Shenshah Baba Avtar Singh Ji*. Her faith,

devotion and conviction upon Nirankar pleased *Shenshah Ji* with the result that she was blessed to become the wife of his son Gurbachan Singh Ji. In 1963 Gurbachan Singh Ji was entrusted with the duty of carrying forward the mantle of the Sant Nirankari Mission. *Shenshah Ji*, noticing her dedication and sense of duty towards humanity, elevated Kulwant Kaur Ji to sit upon the same stage as the Satguru and pronounced that henceforth she be known as Nirankari Rajmata Ji. As the life partner of '*Yugparvartak*' Baba

Gurbachan Singh Ji Maharaj, she walked shoulder to shoulder in the performance of their responsibilities towards the Mission. The Mission's teachings about family and social responsibility, were first practiced and followed within the household of Rajmata ji, creating an exemplary environment for all to uphold and follow.

R a j m a t a J i accompanied Baba Gurbachan Singh Ji on all Salvation Tours for 17 years, be it in India or across the Globe, travelling extensively by road, rail, sea and air. One such journey was undertaken by road from India, crossing Asia through Europe and reaching the United Kingdom. After 1980, the next three and a half decades were spent in a similar fashion serving Satguru Baba Hardev Singh Ji. History may never reveal such a person who has served 3 Spiritual Masters, in three very different capacities,

a daughter in law, a spouse and a mother.

The body of Nirankari Rajmata Ji lay in repose at the Sant Nirankari Satsang Bhawan, Nirankari Colony, Delhi from the evening of 29th August until the morning of the 31st. Tens of thousands of devotees, as well as well-wishers filled into the inner courtyard of the Bhawan to pay their respect and acquire final *Darshan*. Simultaneously hundreds of thousands of devotees across the globe observed the occasion and paid homage through the live telecast hosted on the Nirankari website. The solemn atmosphere was calmed by the continuous recital of the *Sampuran Avtar Bani*, connecting all with the word of the '*Shenshah*'.

The concluding journey of this unique personage left no soul with a dry eye; even the heavens made their presence felt with a thunderous downpour. His Holiness Nirankari Baba Hardev Singh Ji Maharaj paid His respect by placing the first wreath upon the body of Nirankari Rajmata Ji. Members of the Sant Nirankari Mandal, Central Planning & Advisory Board, Sant Nirankari Charitable Foundation and Mission's representatives from foreign countries followed Him.

At noon, the *Palki* carrying the mortal body of Nirankari Rajmata Ji was personally escorted by His Holiness to the Nigam Bodh Ghat Crematorium, in a 3km long procession. Despite the rain, Satguru and the devotees both stood undeterred.

Prerna Diwas Samagam was held on the 1st of September. Many shared innumerable accounts of Rajmata Ji's life, devotion and *Gursikhi*. Emotional sentiments filled the occasion and prevailed throughout, even the Satguru whilst recounting the invaluable qualities and lifelong

contribution to the Mission by Nirankari Rajmata Ji, was unable to contain His deep emotions.

Satguru Baba Hardev Singh Ji Maharaj further impressed upon on a social message of how one should always hold dear the value of their parents, particularly focusing on the ability of one's good fortune to practice the act of '*Charan Sparsh*.'

Further He said that the word *Triveni* was used when Raj Mata Ji was present in physical form, but even today after she has merged into Nirankar, the *Triveni* still exists. Rajmata Ji always stressed upon us to consider the entire *Sadh Sangat* as our mother. Therefore, we can still become beneficiaries of her presence through the *Sadh Sangat*.

During her final moments, Satguru Baba Hardev Singh Ji Maharaj asked Rajmata Ji to bestow her blessings upon us all so that we may inherit a Mission that she and all the elders before her envisioned. In conclusion the Satguru exhorted that all devotees should remain within the ambit of *Gurmat* and to take the Mission forward with the pristine dedication that prevailed in the era of Shenshah Ji and Baba Gurbachan Singh Ji.

The forthcoming Sunday (07/09/14) was also to be dedicated throughout the world in the memory of Nirankari Rajmataji.

responsibility for supply of milk. Everyone was busy in completing the allotted responsibility.

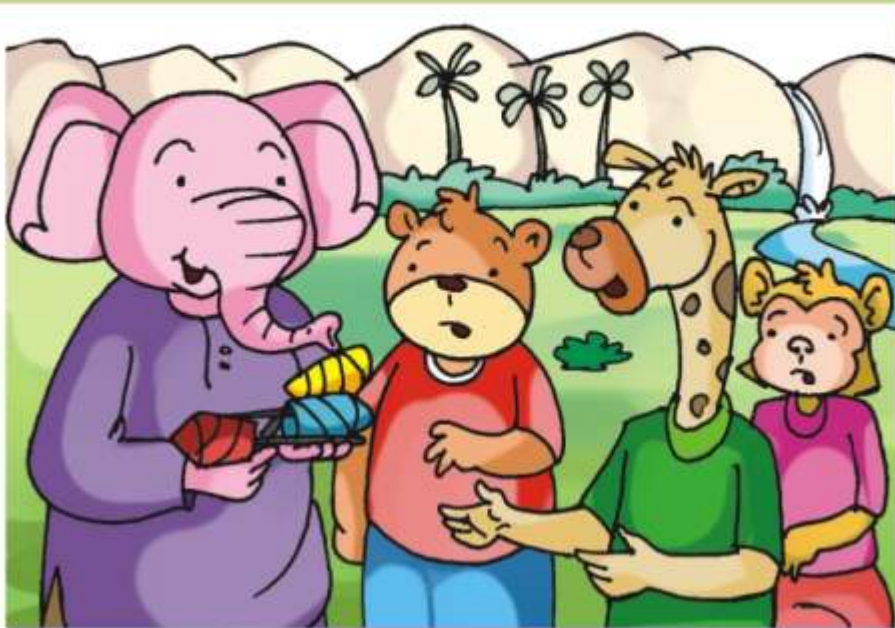

Strange Life of Bat

In places of cold weather, the bats often hide themselves in the caves during winters. The feeding mother bats stick closer to the children. This maintains a desired temperature. If disturbed by anyone, the entire flock will scatter, causing a sudden drop in temperature and resulting in death of many children birds.

Many Mughal kings built huge buildings for bats to reside comfortably. It was done due to a belief that sporting bats leads to increase in wealth and safety from any difficult or wrong phase of period.

In the middle of the tenth century, a ruler in Rome excavated a place where bats resided, and found a huge treasure. Since then, a belief spread all over that places where bats resided were indicators of hidden treasures. Anyway ...

In the lap of nature, there are numerous kinds of bats. However, you would not have heard about the blood-sucking bats. Let us introduce you with some of their strange acts.

The blood-sucking bats are found only in Mexico. They hit as many as about 10 lakh animals per year. Mostly, the targets are horses, dogs and pigs. Sometimes, they even dare to place their dangerous teeth on human bodies too.

Each of these bats weighs about 28 grams, with a circumference of around 30 centimeters.

Normally, these bats hunt only the animals with warm blood. Their 20 teeth are just like knives which are pierced into the prey. Their feet are soft and spongy.

Among these bats, there is a special creed known as 'Dimbi' which travel in units of about 50. Each unit is capable of killing an elephant. Looking at them, an elephant with its trunk raised high, would cry aloud and try to run away at its best. ■

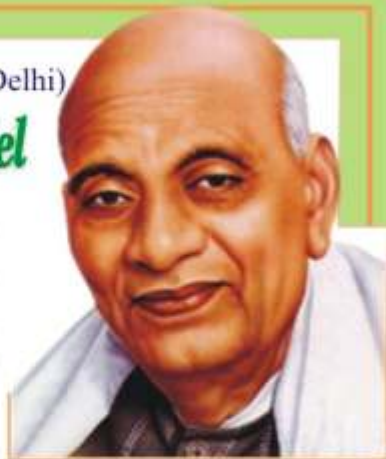

Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel

Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel, known as the 'Iron man of India', was a major political and social leader of India. He became the first Deputy Prime Minister and Home Minister of India. He played a leading role in the country's struggle for Independence and guided its integration into a united nation. He was awarded Bharat Ratna in 1991.



Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel was born on 31st October, 1875 at Nadiad in Gujarat. His father Jhaverbhai was a farmer and mother Laad Bai was a religious lady. A brilliant student throughout his career, he wanted to become a barrister. He borrowed books from a lawyer friend and study from home. Moreover, he attended court sessions to observe arguments being thrown closely. He went to London and passed the examination with flying colours. After returning back to India, he became the foremost criminal lawyer. He was offered many lucrative posts by the British Government but he rejected all. Prior to his joining the freedom movement, he was elected as Ahmedabad's Municipal President in 1922, 1924 and 1927 during which the city saw major reforms in the field of electricity supply and education. In 1918, Kheda was ruined by floods. Therefore, farmers demanded relief

from the heavy taxes of British government but to no avail. Vallabhbhai Patel struggled against it. As a result, the government hold talks and agreed to roll back the taxes. The similar incident took place in Bardoli in 1928. He inspired the farmers not to pay tax and fought through the oppression till the British government bowed down. He then earned the title of Sardar, the chief.

Vallabhbhai Patel was very impressed with Mahatma Gandhi's ideology. When Mahatma Gandhi was in prison, he lead a satyagraha in Nagpur in 1923 against a law banning the raising of the Indian flag. He organised thousands of volunteers in processions hoisting the flag. As a result, the British government allowed nationalists to hoist the flag in public.

In 1930, he also gave speeches to large crowds across India asking them to participate in the Civil disobedience movement. He was elected President of the Indian National Congress in 1931. He also participated in the Quit India Movement. During the freedom struggle, he was jailed for many years. Soon after the Indian Independence, more than 550 princely states ruled by Maharajas and Nawabs wanted to become independent rulers of their kingdoms like in the pre-British era. It was Sardar Patel's insight, wisdom and diplomacy that won over all those rulers without bloodshed. He reorganized the states to help transform India into a modern federal republic. So, he is regarded as the true architect of united India post independence. He died on 15 December, 1950.

Attractive Bird : Hud-Hud



The national bird of all European countries is HUD-HUD. When it speaks, a sound like “Uk-Uk” is heard, which, as per Europeans is “Hup-Hup”. Because of this sound, the Europeans called it ‘Hupu’. The Israelis understood it as “Hud-Hud and named it “Hud-Hud”. In many parts of our country, it is known as ‘Hajamin’. It has beautiful feathers at his head and for this reason many people call it as ‘Shah Suleman’. It was called as Upua in ancient Rome, and as Ipopus in Greece.

Hud-Hud has a long, sharp and thin beak through which it easily finds out insects, worms etc, hidden under the earth. It is not fond of fruits and flowers. Insects and worms are its favourites. Often, it is found in parks, gardens and old and abandoned houses. It has beautiful looks. Both, male and female, have crown like feathers on heads which increase

their beauty. The body is multi-coloured. The feathers are golden and black while the front part of the neck is almond-coloured.

Hud-Hud has about a dozen of variety. One of it can be called an international one, having white colour and found in European countries. Another variety is found in Israel and Arabian countries. Its eggs are light blue in colour. It makes its nest in holes of trees, walls, old houses. The female produces 3 to 10 eggs and does not leave them till they are hatched. During this period, male cares for the food.

It had a special place in wall paintings of ancient Greece. The Jews call it a bird of heaven and treat it as a sacred one. It was once considered that its feathers were of real gold; and under this ignorance, this bird was destroyed in a large number.

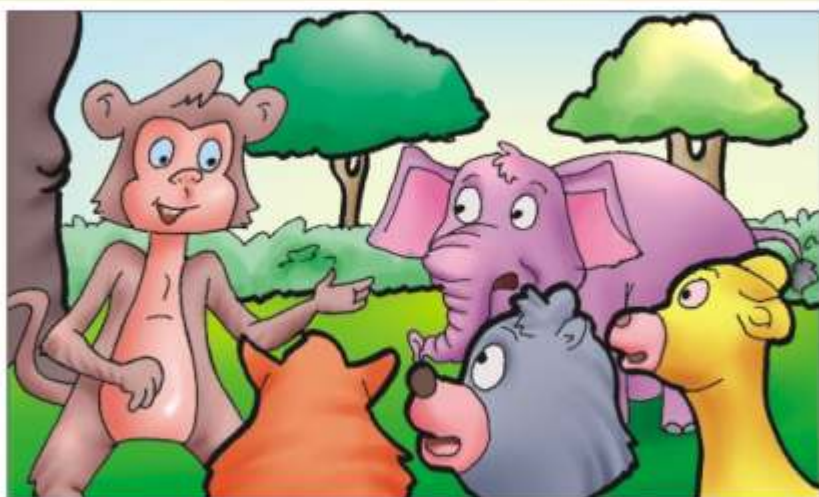
Hindu Mythology :

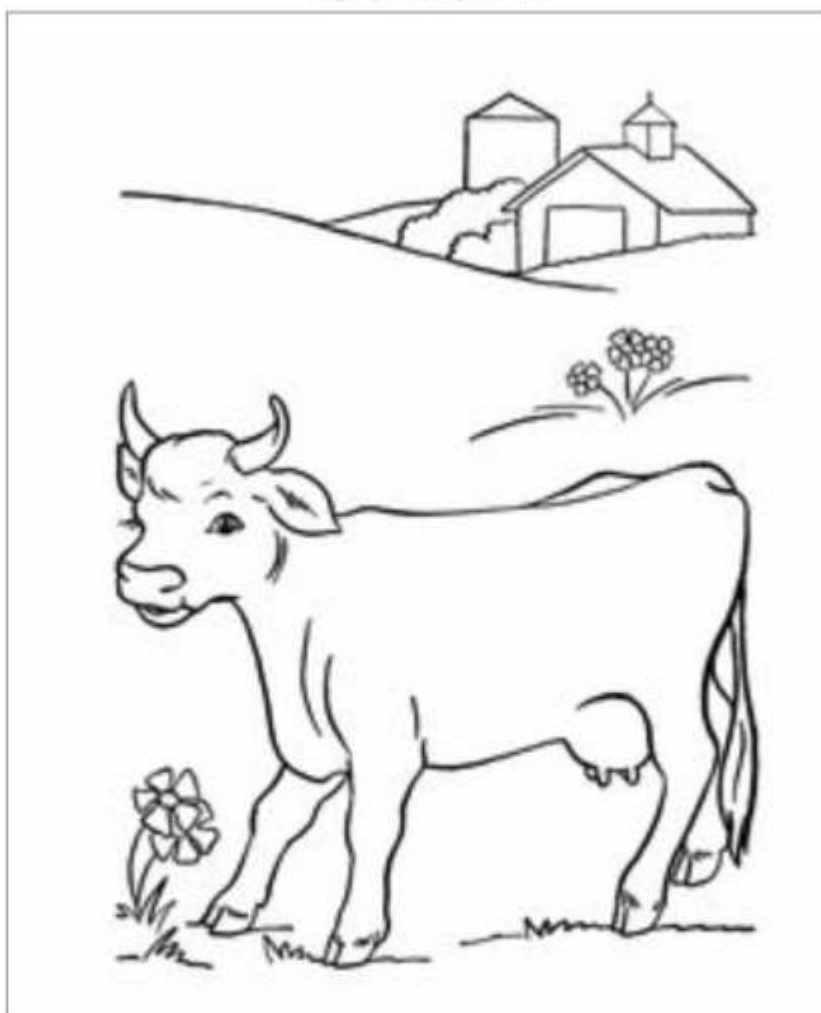

Gandhi Ji's Three Monkeys

And these principles reached Japan from China in the Eighth Century. At that time, Japan was almost ruled by the Shinto community which gave a lot of attention and respect to monkeys. It was possibly the reason that these three principles were inscripted in the shape of monkeys by Shinto community. This is how it is included in UNESCO's List.

The names of these monkeys are Mizaroo (Don't see bad), Mikazaroo (Don't listen bad), and Mazaroo (Don't say bad).

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
