Secular Child Becomes Popular

A study of 400 children conducted by the Ranchi University confirms that religious identity in children emerges as early as at the age of four and reaches the peak by nine. Communal elements in almost all religions are gaining ground and religious slots are being drilled into little heads. Unless practical steps are taken, the younger generation will grow up in an atmosphere of hate and suspicion which can prove very dangerous to the society.

The children almost instinctively learn to do what they see there parents doing. Therefore, the process of secularism should begin with the parents and adults who are essentially expected to maintain secular behaviour at home.

In the schools, the teachers are also expected to encourage the students to maintain the most adjustable behaviour with their class-mates. Sharing room in hostels, participating in each other's festivals and paying mutual visits to the families can add to harmonious relationship beyond one's faith.

When a child is secular both at home and in school, he becomes popular in the neighbourhood also. He is found quick to sympathise and slow to criticise any of his neighbours. He treats them as extension of his own family and, in turn, gets praises and blessings everywhere.

With good wishes behind and expectations ahead, such a child naturally puts his heart and soul in his studies which hold his future career. Sky is the limit of his success. Life generally means competition with the other and happiness means success over the other — in the class room as well as in other fields. Not seeing the other as a potential opponent, he believes that everything happens as per Cosmic law. In due course, he discovers that secularism is another name of spiritualism and he belongs to a much bigger world than that denoted by this postal address!

Net de-addiction

Kids As Young As 10 Being Counselled



New Delhi: In the post-digital world, here's a first for the capital. Worried over lack of socialization due to an internet-driven lifestyle among children, an NGO has launched an internet de-addiction centre in Delhi.

The centre operates from a three-storey building in South Delhi's Sarvodaya Enclave, where counselors and psychologists nudge children as young as 10 years old to participate in activities such as indoor games and converse with each other.

Experts at the centre say the cases coming in are diverse but the under-lying problem is common—an addiction to the internet among a growing number of children in the capital.

Take the instance of a 14-year-old boy, whose performance in school has seen a decline in recent months.

His parents blame his obsession with Facebook for the low grades.

In another case, an older teenager

locks himself up at night and spends hours chatting with friends on his smart phone. "The first thing he does after getting up is go online and check messages. He becomes restless if the wi-fi or 3g network goes off," said Rakshit Bahadur (name changed), the child's father.

Doctors say internet addiction could be leading to a drop in grades and increased aggression. But getting the kid to accept this is difficult.

"Most of them would flatly refuse. So we came up with a questionnaire where we ask indirect questions such as time spent on the mobile and the number of networking sites where the child has an account. The answers are shocking.

★ Monitor internet activity ★ Break internet addiction by keeping the computer in a family room ★ Spend more time with the child * If child has limited social interactions, consider a social skills class or seek activities that connect the child with peers ★ Encourage outdoor activities

Even fifth graders have access to Facebook, What-sapp and other chat sites. They have many games on their phones," said Rahul Verma, head of Uday foundation that started the centre.

Rahul Verma, head of the NGO that has started the Centre for Children Internet and Technology Distress, said internet addiction is similar to addictive disorders concerning drugs or alcohol.

"Teenagers are particularly prone to internet addiction. In many cases, the addiction leads to insomnia, depression and social withdrawal," said Dr Tara, one of the doctors running the clinic.

She said parents were also to blame. "We come across many children who try to make virtual friends because in real world they have few people to talk to. In many case, these kids have both parents who are working. In some cases, internet overuse is seen in parents of such children," she added. Experts say these cases are likely to be the iceberg in a country where use of smartphones and tablets is rise at breakneck pace. The de-addiction centre tries to indulge children in real-life activities such as interactive education, science-based unique programming and device-free retreats.
