
## **Trees Have Life**

It was afraid that aunty could meet with a fatal accident in case she lit the lights on as he was certain that there was a gas leakage in the room.

Tinu waited impatiently for the return of leopard aunty. There was a tea stall of Bhaloo uncle. Tinu sat there and kept a constant eye on aunt's house. After about half-an-hour, Tinu saw leopard aunty returning with a bag full of vegetables. Tinu reached the door ahead of her. After exchange of greetings, Tinu asked whether she could sense a bad smell. Aunty told that it was there since evening when it installed the new cylinder. Tinu asked aunty what would she do now. Aunty replied that she would turn on the lights, prepare tea and then cook dinner. No! exclaimed Tinu. If the gas leaked, no light should be turned on. It could cause fire and burst the cylinder; the whole house could catch fire.

'Really, I didn't know', said the leopard aunty. 'Good you told me. Similar incident happened a month back in my uncle's house. He lit a match box while the gas was leaking, resulting fire in the house and deep burns on his body'.

Tinu said that we could avoid accidents by taking precautionary measures and save our lives. If we carefully use these modern gadgets with sufficient preliminary knowledge, these can become our friends instead.

Leopard aunty said Tinu was right. Your advice is useful and knowledgeable. I would teach everyone about appropriate steps and precautions necessary for use of the gas so as to avoid any untoward incidents. Tinu, you should tell me as to



what other safety steps should I take now to stop gas leakage in my house. Tinu advised the aunty to:

- ★ First of all, open all the doors and windows of the house.
- ★ Do not light any matchbox or candle.
- Close the regulator and put on the safety cap on the cylinder.
- ★ Close the knob and dial emergency number of your distributor. These numbers are printed on the receipts provided for gas deliveries.
- ★ In case it turns out to be a case of fire leakage, dial immediately 101.

Leopard aunty did accordingly; opened all the doors and windows; took action on all the tips and then phoned the distributor. The distributor immediately replaced the cylinder and asked for aunt's pardon for the leakage. He advised her that the cylinder should be checked regularly; use a quality tube of 1.5 meter length. The tube should be protected from heat and fire. There should be no cover on the gas

pipe and should be cleaned by a wet cloth from time to time. It should be changed after its use of one year.


Leopard aunty asked Tinu about any further precaution so that she could tell about every precaution to everyone in the village. Tinu said that there are a few more precautions, such as:

- \* Knob should be put off after use of gas
- ★ The cylinder should not be hit in any manner
- ★ Fitting of tube on cylinder should be regularly checked
- one should wear cotton clothes while using kitchen
- ★ Plastic objects should be kept away from the cylinder
- ★ Get attentive in case there is a smell of gas
- \* Regulator should be turned off.

The innocent pigeon was taken in his clever words. He gave bread to the crow and said, "First you take this bread to ease your pain. I would manage my hunger some how."


The crow wanted this only. It immediately caught hold of pigeon's bread and was over joyed at its cleverness.

#### INVENTION OF TELESCOPE

Children, You must have seen the telescope. Generally, it is used in ships. We have been able to learn about moon and stars by viewing these through telescope only. The credit of it's invention goes to an Italian scientist, Galileo.

Galileo Galilei is known for his invention of telescope. The great contribution made to the scientific world by him through his invention is priceless. Galileo Galilei had to sacrifice his life also for his invention. Let us know more about the life of Galileo Galilei.

Galileo Galilei was born on February 15, 1564 in Pizza, a city of Italy. His father named Vincenzo Galilei was a musician. Galileo Galilei was eldest among seven brothers and sisters. Their family was very poor. He got his primary education from Florence city. On growing old, he helped his father in his business. His father re-started his education knowing him to be brilliant.

Once Galileo went to Venus. There he came to know that a person from Belgium had made such an instrument through which we can see the far-off things near. But there was a flaw that everything looked inverted through it. Knowing this Galileo started preparing the telescope. After stringent efforts of two months, he was able to prepare two glasses of the telescope and fitted these on the two ends of a copper made pipe. This was the first successful telescope of the world. The things lying at a far-off distance could be seen bigger, clear and straight through this. After this he continued trying to make it still better.

In April 1597, Galileo made such a telescope that could view an article with 32 times magnified image. Galileo started selling that telescope at his shop from 1609. The telescope sold at that time was able to view things at a short



distance. This telescope proved that there are stains in the sun. Milkyway is a group of stars. There are various satellites of Jupiter.

Galileo, by telling the miraculous happenings in the sky through his telescope, he invented important principles in the field of astronomy also which included logical views on sound, light, color and the formation of this universe. Galileo was honoured in 1611 for his invention of telescope.

Galileo made about 200 telescopes and donated these to various educational Institutions for astronomical observations. He wrote his book in Italy language so that even a common man could also read. Galileo had countered the views of Church, so he had to face judicial enquiry and many more atrocities. Galileo was a great exponent of scientific thinking. Galileo can be called as the father of the modern science. Galileo became famous in the world due to his invention of the telescope. He was the first person who traced four moons of the Jupiter satellite. Along with he saw stains of the Sun and art of the Venus. During his experiments, he reached the conclusion that all satellites revolve around the sun.




#### Q. What is thermo-electric current?

#### Q. What is an Atomic Reactor?







## Dr. Rajendra Prasad

## An Ideal of Simplicity

Dr.Rajendra Prasad, affectionately addressed as 'Rajen Babu', was born at Village Ziradei of Bihar on 3 December 1884. His parents, Mahadev Sahay

and Kamaleshwari Devi, led a simple life even though the family had sufficient landed property. The environment at home had a profound impact on the mind of young Rajen resulting in the inculcation in him of the finest ideals of fellow-feeling, selfless service, sacrifice, humility and simplicity.

Rajendra Prasad began his early education at the age of five under the guidance of a village Maulvi. Later, he went to a High School in Chhapra district from where he passed the entrance examination of the University of Calcutta with flying colours and joined the prestigious Presidency College. After his postgraduation, he also completed his studies in law and started legal practice in Calcutta in 1911. Very soon, he built up a large clientele, not merely because of his legal acumen, but also because of his noble character and innate integrity, which earned him the praise and respect of the judges and his colleagues. He completed his Master of

law in 1915 by topping the list. In 1916, after the creation of the Patna High Court, Rajendra Prasad started practicing at Patna.

Rajendra Prasad came under the spell of Mahatma Gandhi in 1917. Inspired by Gandhian ideology, his clarion call to the countrymen and his distinct and unprecedented mode of protest against the colonial rulers, Rajendra Prasad took the plunge into the political struggle with the unflinching aim of freeing the country from the clutches of colonialism.

The Rowlatt Act of 1918 and the Jallianwala Bagh massacre of 1919 pushed Rajendra Prasad closer to Gandhi Ji; he concurred with Gandhi Ji that the only effective weapon to deal with the British Government's inhuman actions and repressive laws was, 'noncooperation'. He was the first leader from Bihar to sign and undertake a pledge requiring every Satyagrahi to remain nonviolent during the protest against the Rowlatt Act which came to be dubbed as the 'Black Act'. In 1923, Rajendra Prasad actively participated in the Flag Satyagraha at Nagpur. During this period, he came into close contact with Sardar Patel whose friendship and association he cherished as one of the most pleasant memories of his life. The British Government arrested him for taking part in the 1930 Satyagraha. The

second long spell of imprisonment that Rajendra Prasad suffered was immediately after the passing of the Quit India Resolution in 1942 and he remained in jail for nearly three years till 1945.

Joining the Indian National Congress as an ordinary worker, Rajendra Prasad served the organization in various capacities for more than four decades He was elected President of the Indian National Congress in 1935 and again in 1939 following the resignation of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose. He was elected President of the Indian National Congress for the third time in 1947, following the resignation of Acharya J.B. Kripalani.

In 1946, Rajendra Prasad joined the Interim Government of Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru as the Minister of Food and Agriculture. When the Constituent Assembly was formed in 1946 to frame a Constitution for free India, Dr.RajendraPrasad, who had been elected as a member of the Assembly from the Bihar Province, was given the onerous responsibility of being its President. As President of the Constituent Assembly, he guided and regulated its proceedings with utmost firmness, infinite patience, incisive intellect and abundant grace. Dr. Rajendra Prasad was unanimously elected as the provisional President of India on 24 January 1950, the penultimate day of the last session of the Constituent Assembly. He took the oath of office on 26 January 1950. It was indeed a rare honour that the person who presided over the

Constitution-making body was also given the equally challenging task of defending, protecting and preserving the Constitution. In 1952, he was elected as the first President of the Republic of India and was re-elected as the President of India for the second term in 1957

Dr. Rajendra Prasad, along with India's first Prime Minister. Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru, was able to establish many precedents and conventions culminating in a healthy political relationship between the Head of State and the Head of Government. Even though Rajendra Prasad occupied the highest office in India, he led a very simple life. His integrity, purity of character, humility and devotion, love of humanity and depth of vision marked him out as a towering personality in our national firmament. Rajendra Prasad not only gave the most precious years of his life to the freedom struggle but also worked for the betterment of the under-privileged throughout his life. He was a great humanist whose heart always went to the poor and the distressed.

Dr. Rajendra Prasad relinquished the office of the President of India in 1962, an office which he had adorned for 17 long vears and shifted to an Ashram in Patna. He spent the remaining part of his life in its peaceful and quiet surroundings till he breathed his last on February 28, 1963.

In recognition of the yeoman's service rendered by this illustrious son of India, Dr.Rajendra Prasad was conferred the Bharat Ratna, the nation's highest civilian award, in 1962.


## Health is Wealth


