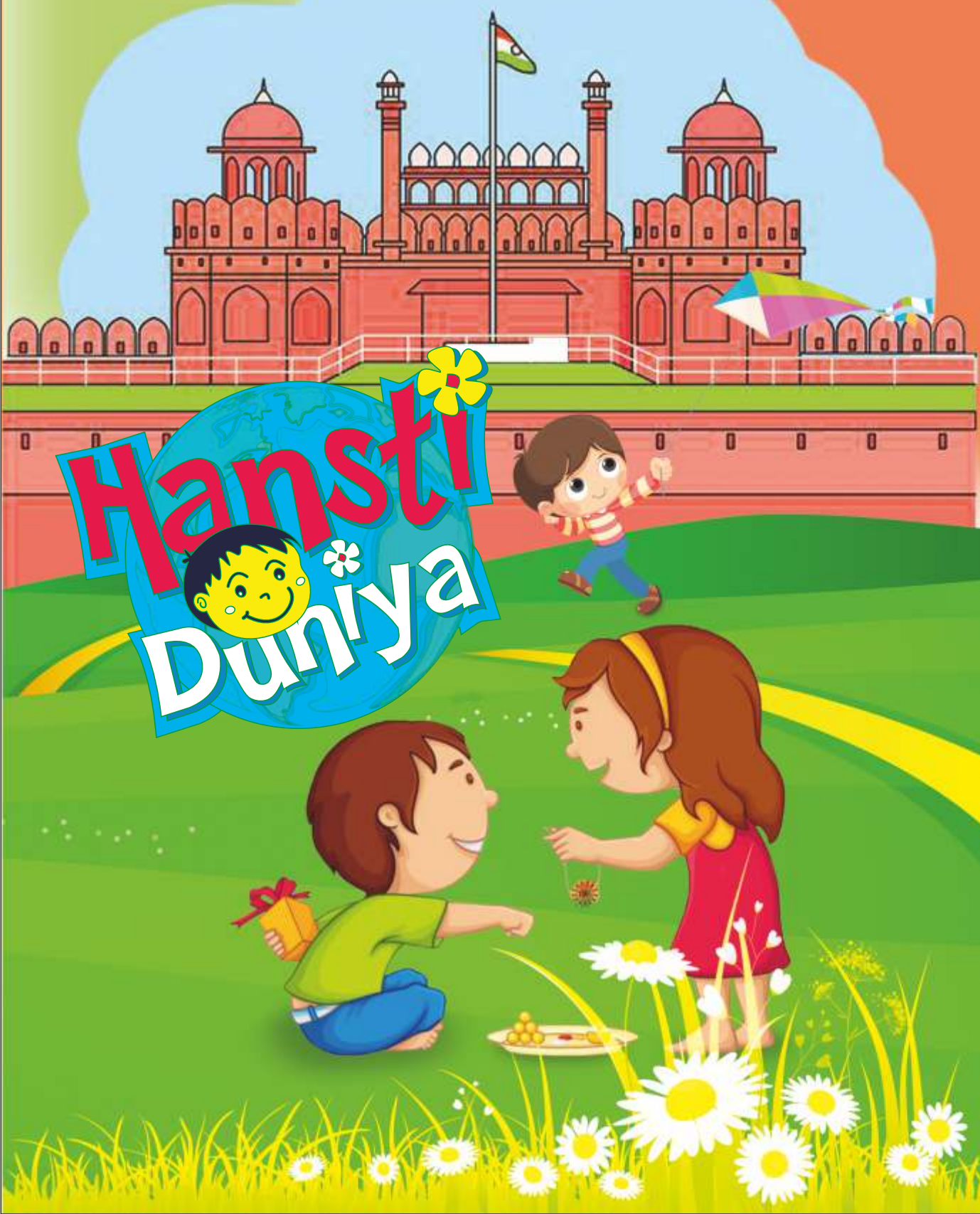

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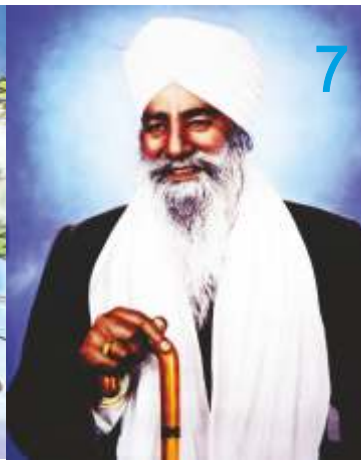


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Strange Experiment

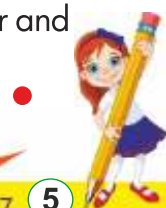


Don't Judge Life

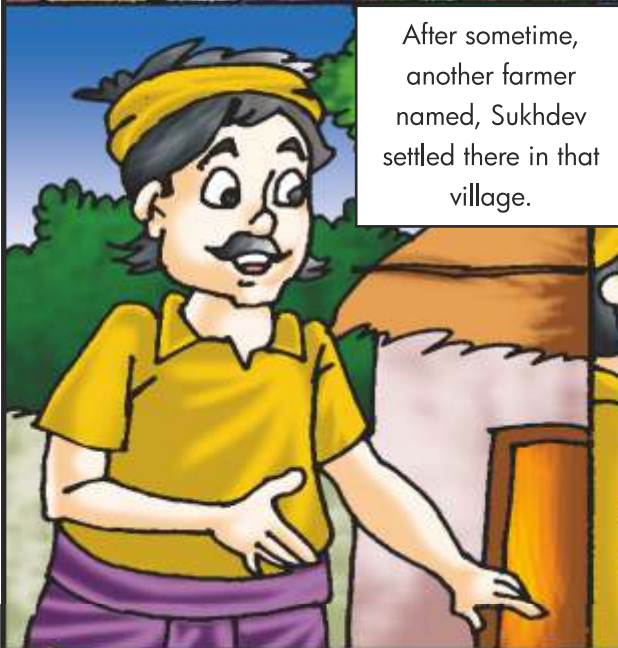

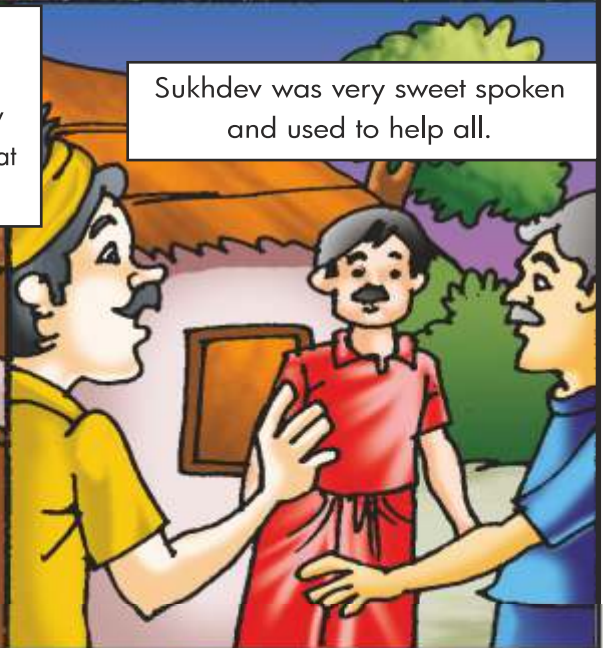


There lived a farmer named Sher Singh in Shergarh village. He was very proud and everybody distanced from him.



After sometime, another farmer named, Sukhdev settled there in that village.

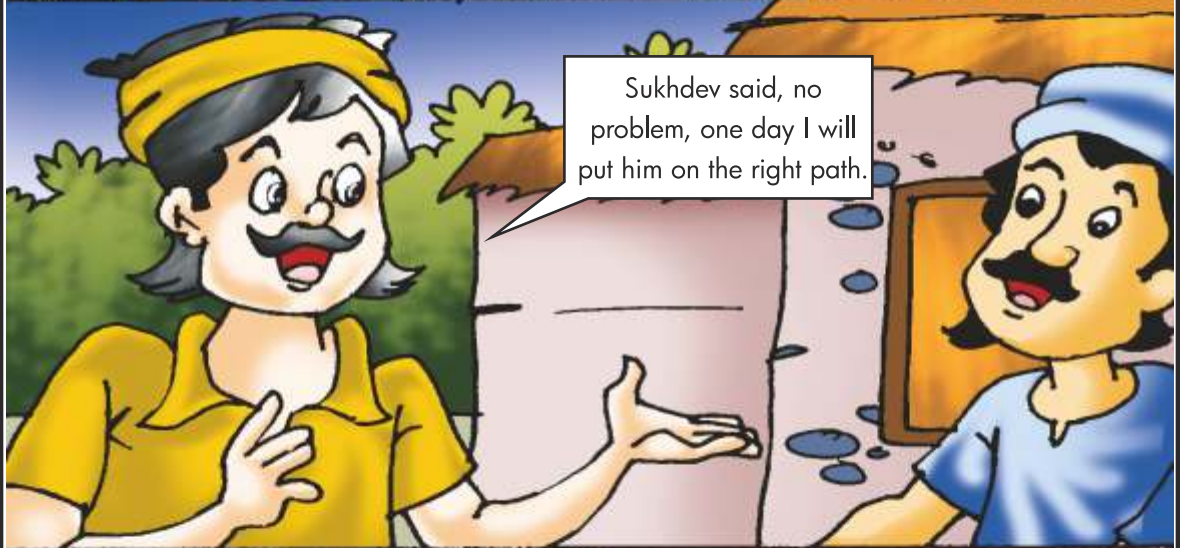
Sukhdev was very sweet spoken and used to help all.



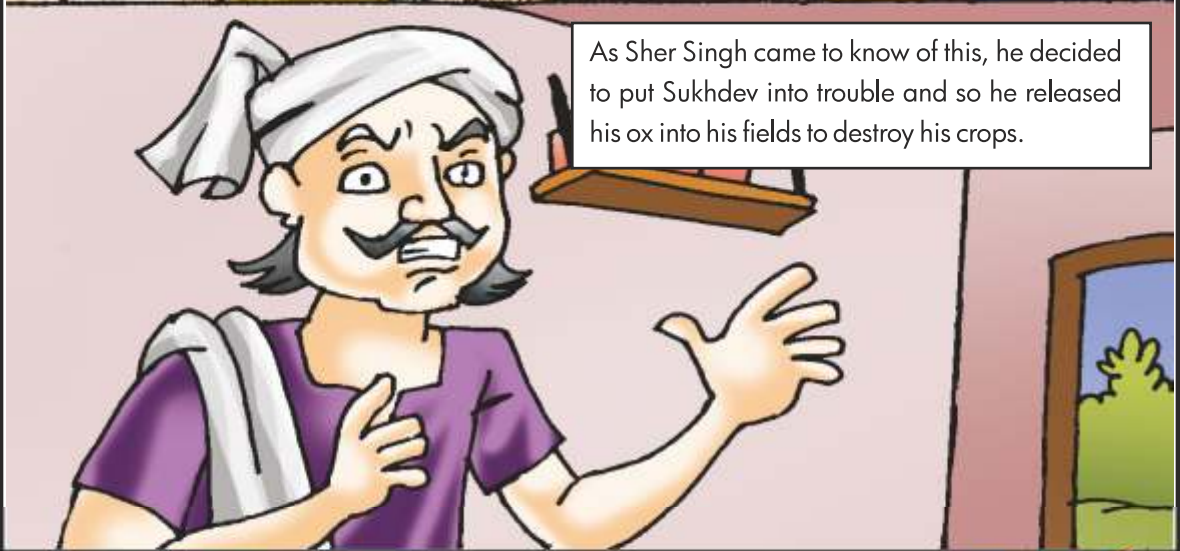
Looking to Sukhdev's behavior, the villagers asked him to keep distance from Sher Singh.

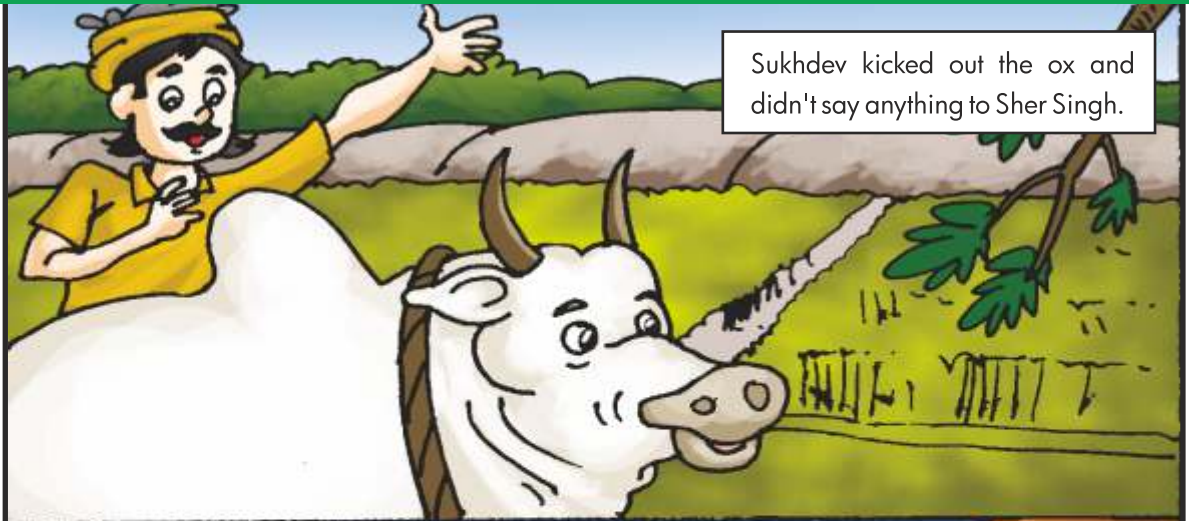


Sukhdev said, no problem, one day I will put him on the right path.

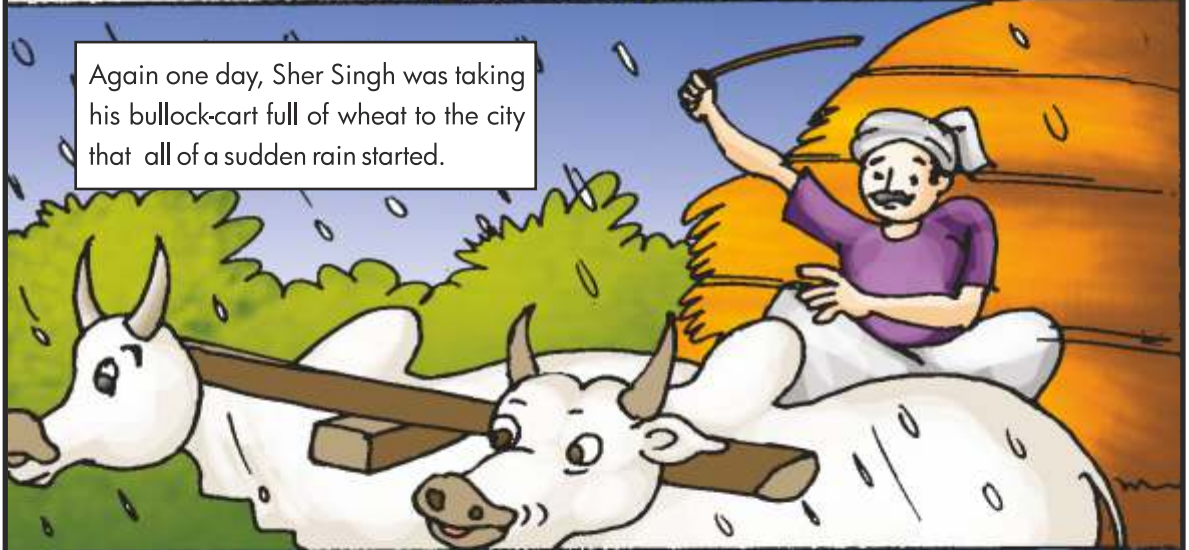


As Sher Singh came to know of this, he decided to put Sukhdev into trouble and so he released his ox into his fields to destroy his crops.

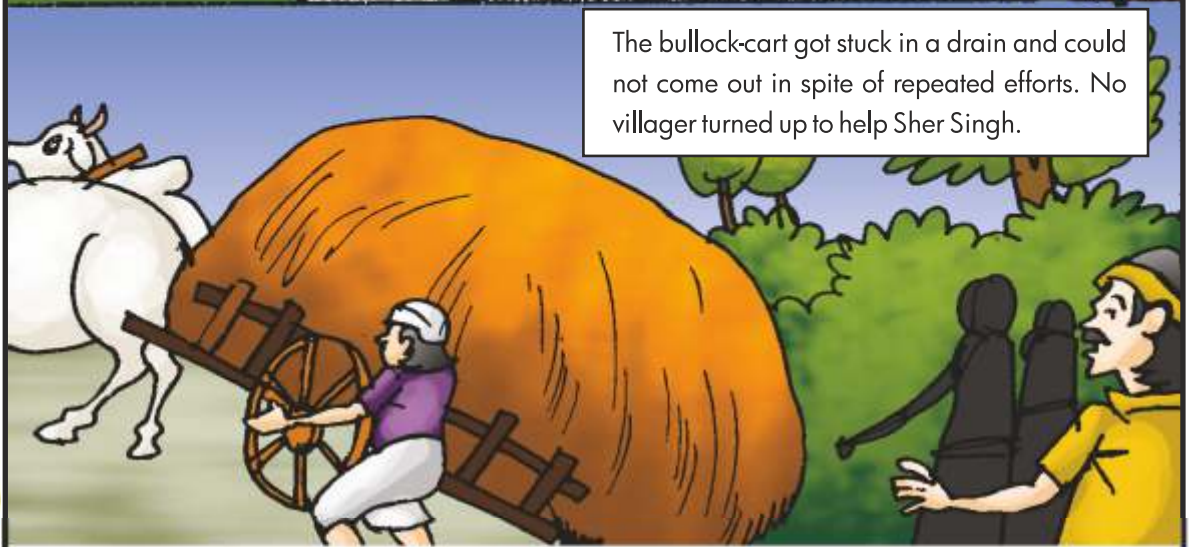




Sukhdev kicked out the ox and didn't say anything to Sher Singh.

"Hello," said Chip's mother.

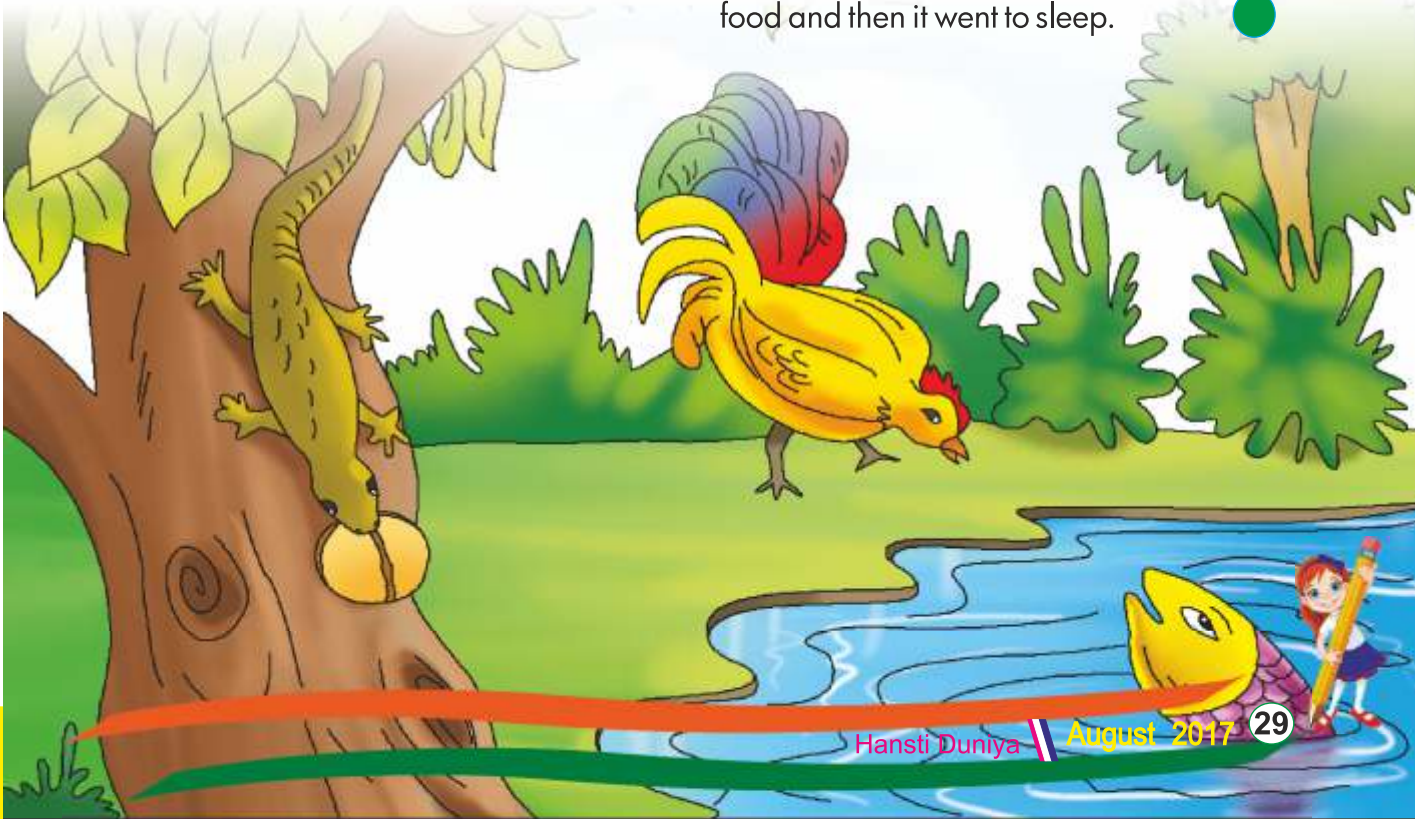
"Where have you been? It is almost dark."

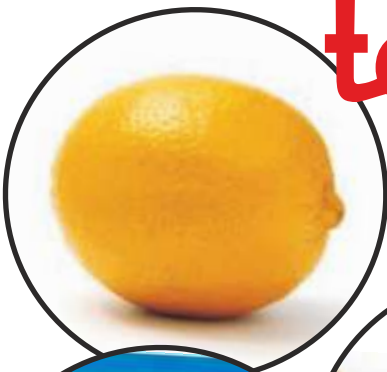
Wow! What beautiful gifts!" said Chip's mother. Then she said, "you must be very hungry after your trip."

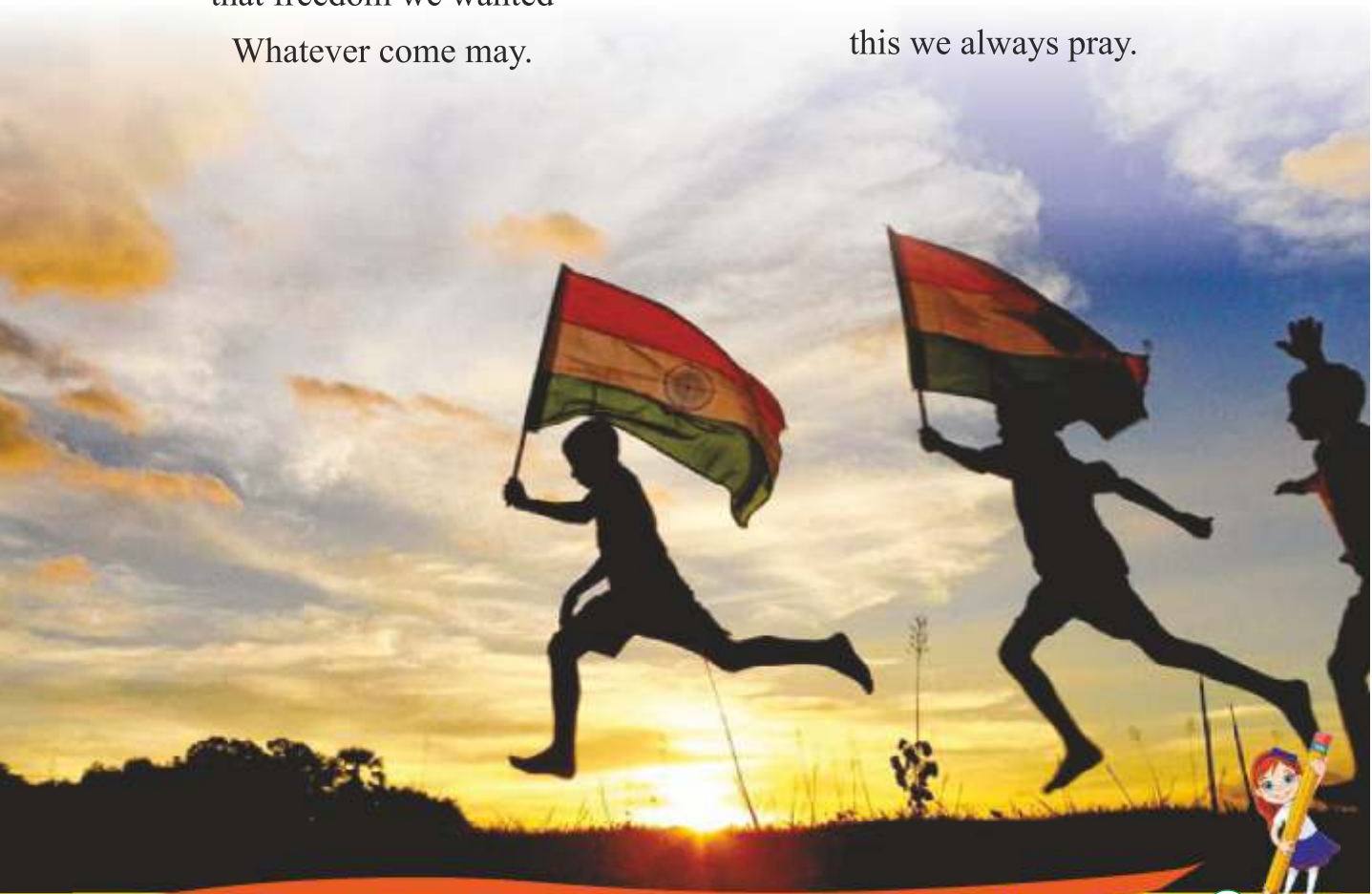

this we always pray.

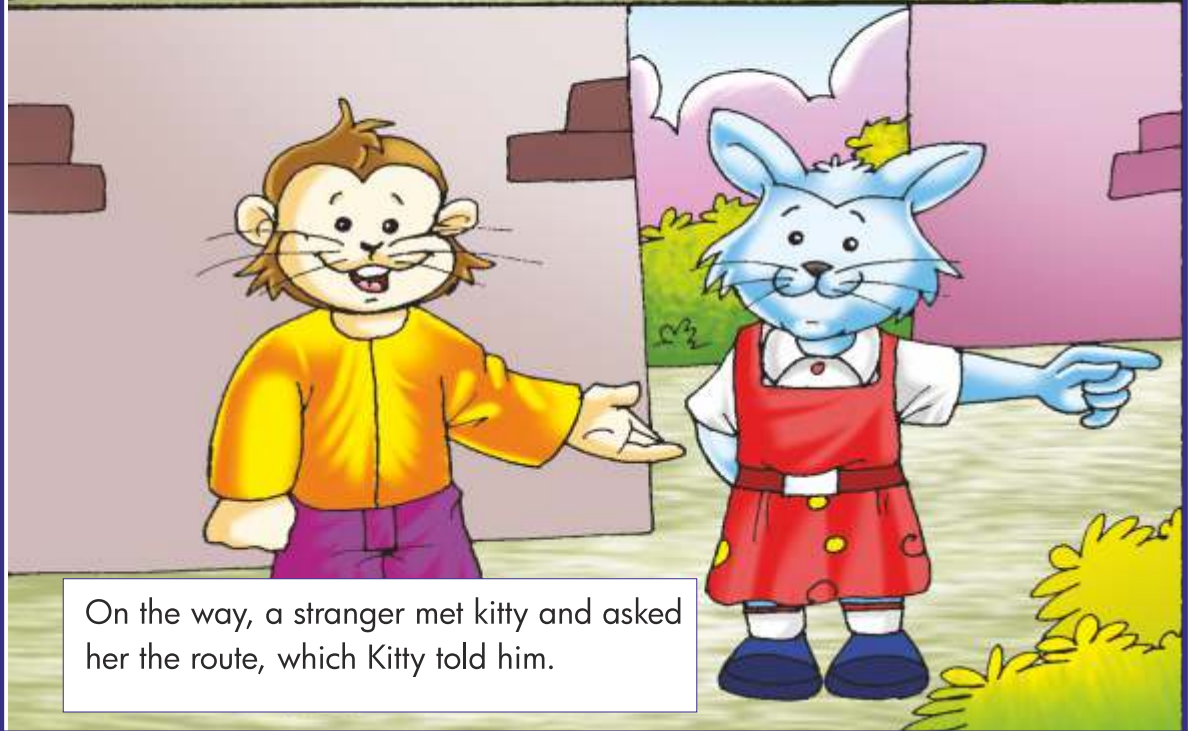




Kitty

When Kitty came to senses, it found itself at an isolated spot and was frightened and started crying.

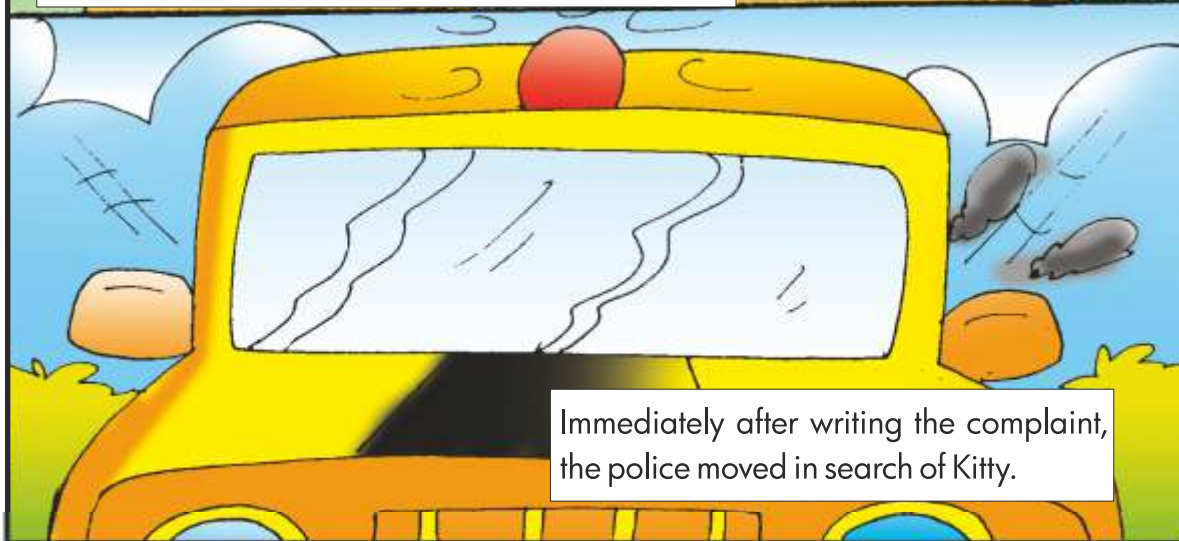




As soon as it tried to get up, again it fell down. Looking to its tied hands and feet, it started crying loudly.

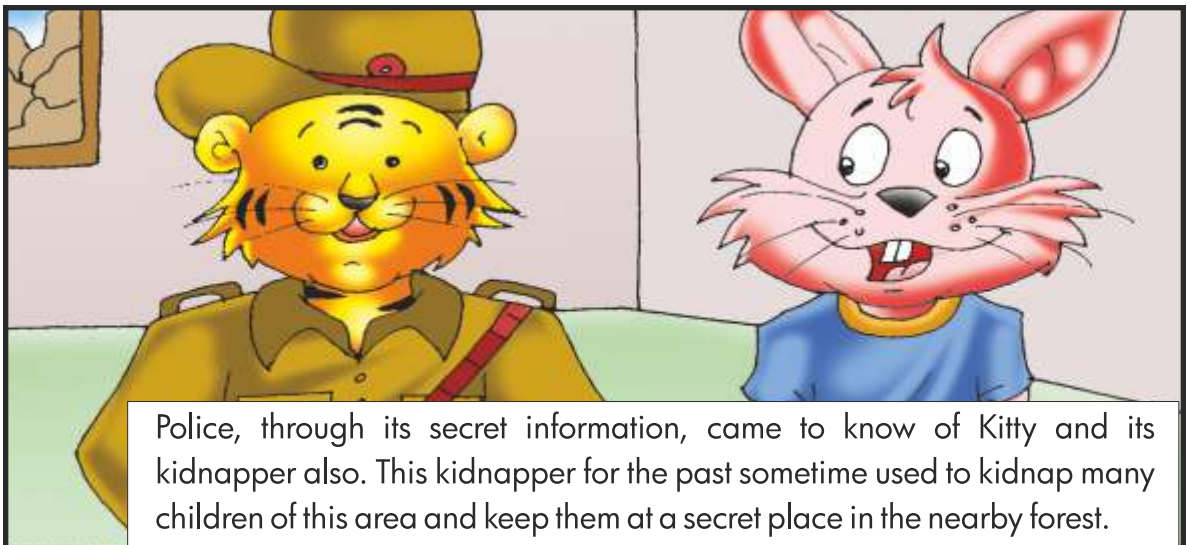


It was evening. At its place, its parents got worried and went to the police to lodge a complaint.



Immediately after writing the complaint, the police moved in search of Kitty.



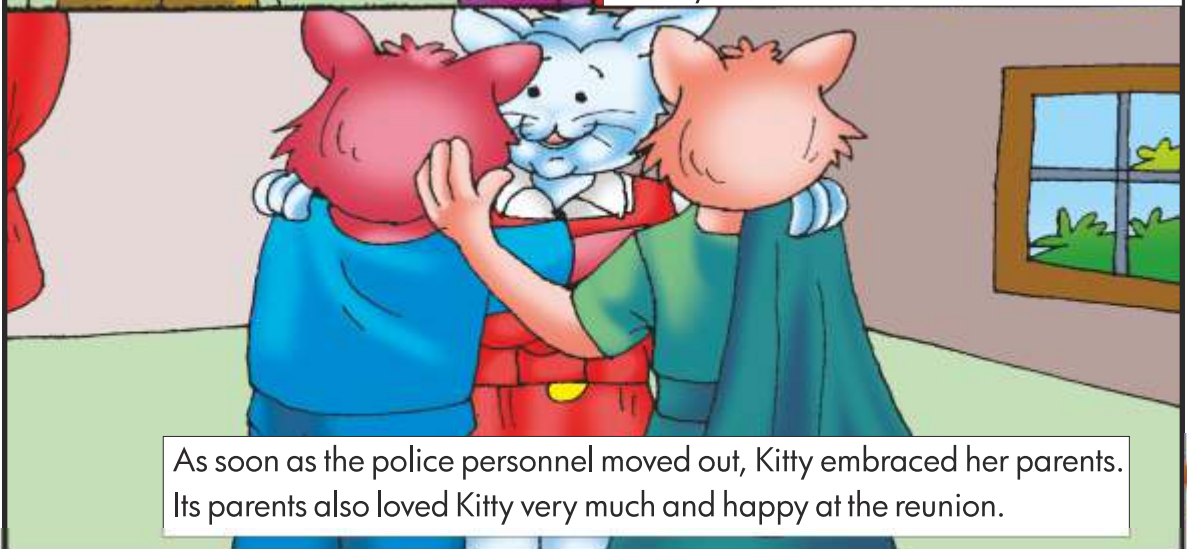

During Raksha-Bandhan, a sister ties a sacred thread known as Rakhi on the wrist of her brother, which signifies the special bond between them. On this occasion, brothers and sisters also exchange gifts among themselves as token of their love and affection towards one another. It is a day to further strengthen the bond between siblings.

Rakhi, like most Indian festivals, has its bearing in mythology. There are several Hindu legends that highlight the importance of this festival. A few interesting ones are here for you to read and enjoy.

The history of Rakhi goes back to the time when the devas and asuras were involved in violent warfare. Indrani, the wife of Indra had tied a silk thread around his wrists to protect



him from danger and the influences of evil spirits.

Traditionally, the Rajputs of the medieval ages also practiced the tying of thread (Rakhi). Rajput women would tie threads around the wrists of the warriors before they marched onto battle field. It was a sign of goodwill and auspiciousness, which would ensure their victory in battle.

Another legend relating Raksha Bandhan goes back to the era of Alexander, the Macedonian conqueror who had attacked the Indian subcontinent with a huge army. He was unsuccessful in defeating king Puru, the ruler of western India. Alexander's wife pleaded to tie a rakhi on Puru and to be accepted as his sister. Puru accepted this gesture and in return agreed not to harm Alexander.

Muhammadan agreed and gave him the elephant.

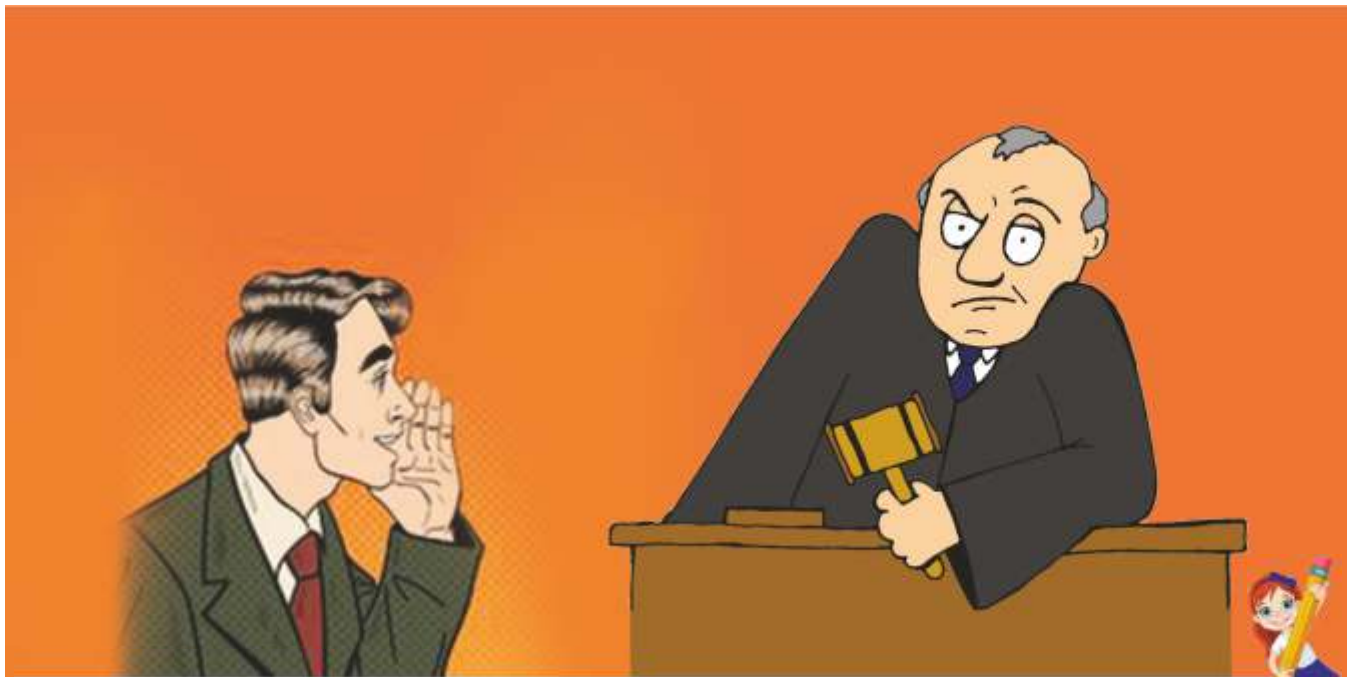
