



Moral: We must not lose courage and balance of mind even under odd circumstances.






NEW HOME FOR WORLD'S RAREST PLANTS

International Yoga Day

International Yoga Day, or commonly referred to as Yoga Day, is observed every year on June 21 since its inception in the year 2015. Yoga itself is a very old practice that is followed in India since time immemorial. Its origin can be traced back to Lord Shiva, who is also called the Adi Yogi (First guru) and is known as the teacher to all the yogis in the world. However, today, the need for a nation that practises yoga on a day-to-day basis was felt by the Prime Minister of India, Shri Narendra Modi, himself.

The idea to observe June 21 as Yoga Day was first proposed by the Prime Minister of India during his speech at the United Nations General Assembly in September 2014. June 21 is the longest day of the year in the Northern Hemisphere. He has stated:

"For us in India, respect for nature is an integral part of spiritualism. We treat nature's bounties as sacred. Yoga is an invaluable gift of India's ancient tradition. Yoga embodies unity of mind and body; thought and action; restraint and fulfilment; harmony between man and nature; a holistic approach to health and well being. It is not about exercise but to discover the sense of oneness with yourself, the world and the nature. By changing our lifestyle and creating consciousness, it can help us deal with climate change and in bettering our well being. Let us work towards adopting an International Yoga Day."

The first International Yoga Day was celebrated all over the world on 21 June, 2015. In India, the day was celebrated at Rajpath, New Delhi, where the Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi and dignitaries from 84 nations participated in the celebrations.

The celebration that happened at Rajpath, New Delhi has established two Guinness world records. The first one was for being the world's largest yoga class as it featured 35,985 people and the second one was for having maximum number of participating nationalities, that is, 84.







India's 3rd Best Performance at Commonwealth Games in India Won 66 Medals, Including 26 Gold.

Gold Coast (Australia). India won 66 medals, including 26 Gold, during 21st Commonwealth Games. In the past 88 years history of the Commonwealth Games, this was the 3rd best performance of India. The performance was better than this during the years 2010 and 2002 only. On the last day of the games held in Gold Coast, India won 7 medals including 1 gold. Saina Nehwal won gold in women's singles Badminton final. Kidambi Shrikant got silver in men's singles Badminton. Chirag Satwik in Badminton Doubles and Deepika Joshna in Squash Doubles got silver.

For the first time, India won 6 medals in Badminton, whereas it had won 4 during Delhi Commonwealth Games.

Saina Nehwal became the first Indian player to win 3 gold in Badminton. This time she won 2 gold. During 2010, 1 gold was won. Thus India completed it's 500 medals. India has become the 5th nation to win 500 medals in Commonwealth Games. Total medals won by India during Commonwealth Games has gone to 504. Other countries winning more than 500 medals are Australia, England, Canada and New Zealand.

Once, the Moon was the only important thing in orbit around planet Earth. Today, many objects circling the Earth have been launched into space by people. All these orbiters, including the Moon, are called 'satellites'. Those launched by people are called 'artificial satellites'.

Communications satellites send telephone, television, and other electronic signals to and from different places on Earth. Weather satellites take pictures of the clouds and wind systems. Various scientific satellites gather information about outer space. There are even 'spy' satellites which take pictures for the military. And there are space stations.

In the late 20th century, the United States, Russia, the European Space Agency, Japan, and Canada joined forces to build the International Space Station (the ISS). It is meant to have people on it all the time. In 1998, the first two ISS modules were launched and joined together in space. In November 2000, the first three-person crew, an American and two Russians, occupied the station, which was stillbeing added to.

Large space stations are planned for the future. These will have many people working in them all the time. They could be like airports are today, where a person changes planes to go to a specific destination. But from a spaceport, people would change spacecraft to travel to the Moon, another planet, or another space station.

Charting the Year

A calendar, like a clock, provides a way to count time - though calendars count days and months rather than minutes and hours. The modern calendar has 12 months of 30 or 31 days each (February has 28, sometimes 29). The calendar year has 365 days, which is about how long it takes the Earth to circle the Sun once. That makes it a solar calendar.

Today's calendar, with a few changes, has been in use since 1582. Pope Gregory XIII had it designed to correct errors in the previous calendar. For this reason, it is called the 'Gregorian calendar'.

The oldest calendars were used to work out when to plant, harvest, and store crops. These were often 'lunar calendars', based on the number of days it took the Moon to appear full and then dwindle away again.

The traditional Chinese calendar is a lunar calendar. It has 354 days, with months of either 29 or 30 days.



Many calendars have religious origins. In Central and South America, the ancient Aztec and Mayan calendars marked ritual days and celebrations. Jews, Muslims, and Hindus have religious calendars - each with a different number of days and months.

All these calendars have one thing in common: they're wrong. None of them measures the Earth's yearlong journey around the Sunprecisely. Extra days must be added to keep the count in step with the actual seasons. We add an extra day to February every four years. (Actually, even our corrections are wrong. Once every 400 years we don't add that day.)





Environment Vs Industry

The major factor for increased environmental pollution is attributable to the rapid growth of industrialization; in-as-much as the industry is responsible for producing maximum amount of environmental pollution.

Three types of industrial wastes, viz., liquids, solids and gases render air and water pollution to a great extent, in addition to the pollution of noise and nature.

Whenever a new industry is created, a township comes into

being. This renders the land around this place unfit for any natural use. Further, it causes removal of hills and forests. This foul play with nature causes heavy damage to environment. Industries continuously need raw materials requiring considerable amount of excavation of earth. This renders valuable land becoming completely unproductive.

Metal-based industries also require excavation of land on regular basis. The dust so produced pollutes air and water. It contains different toxic contents of different colours, turning a normal dresses look as if dyed in different



shades. Even the skins of people get dyed.

The leather industry also creates extreme water pollution. The high voltage electrical plants on river banks also create water pollution as they keep on blowing out acid and ashes.

Similarly, the cement industry adds huge amount of dust containing remains of poisonous gases like carbon mono oxide, carbon dioxide, sulphur dioxide, bringing health of workers and residents at great risk. The Asbestos and Textile industries too release enormous quantity of tiny fibre in air. These fibers, easily inhaleable, cause serious lung problems.

Manufacturing of slate, pencil and fire proof bricks create excessive amount of

dust and sound. The labour class of this area suffers acutely from lung, eye, nose and ear diseases.

The aluminum industry releases a lot of caustic and waste powder. rendering water and air become poisonous.

The polluted air and water spread fast to far off areas and further pollute the unaffected areas. The rains passing

through these areas become acidic, an indicator of dangerous environmental situation.

With the rise in human civilization. the level and number of environmental hazards are also on the rise. With the farsightedness and multipurpose planning, the effects of pollution can be considerably reduced, e.g., replacing high voltage electronic plants with waterbased equipments, big industries with cottage industries. Installation of recycling plant should be made compulsory in big industries. And, most importantly, to grow more and more trees around these industrial places in order to natural freshness, as well as give effectively reduce air, water and land pollution.
