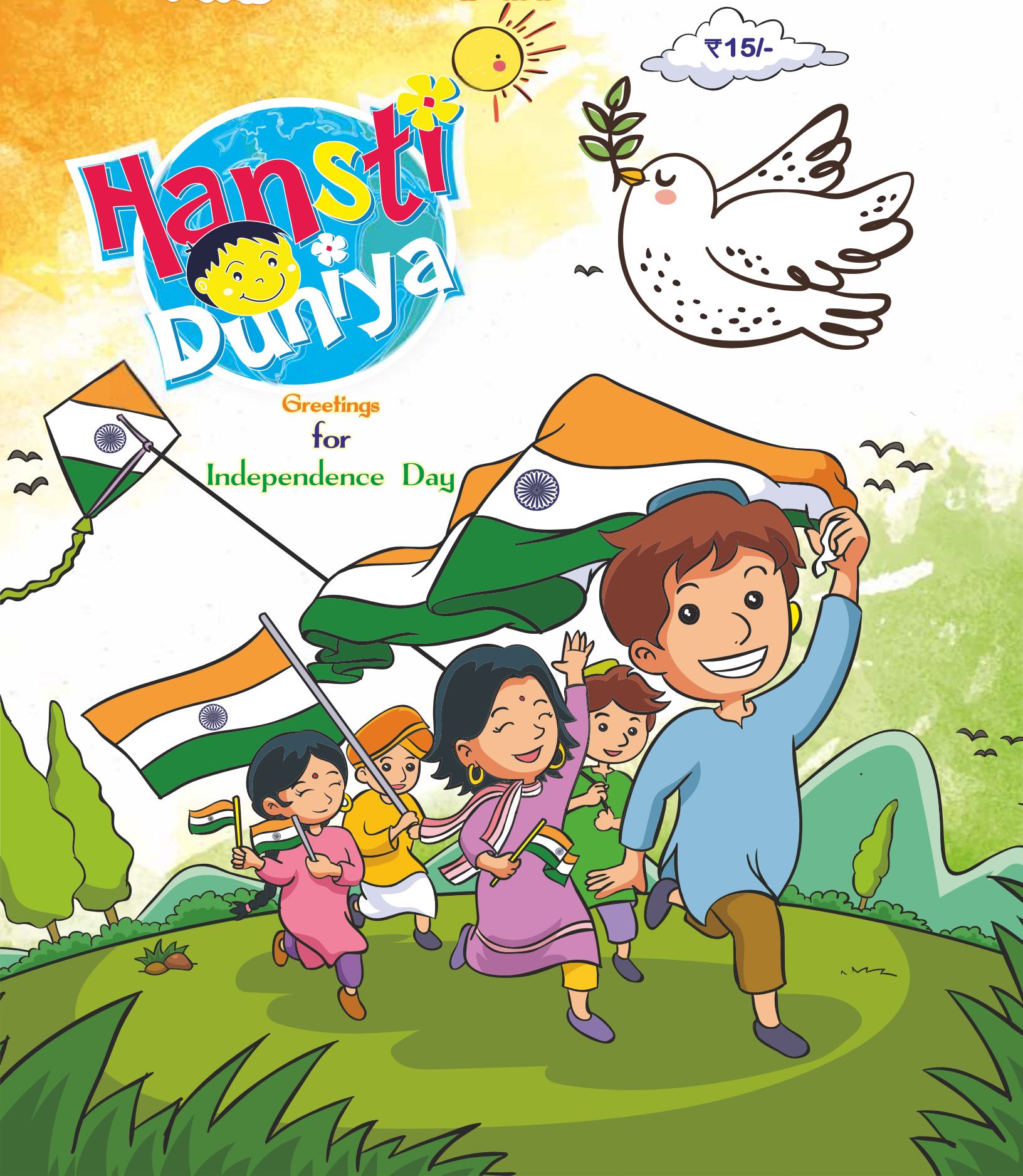

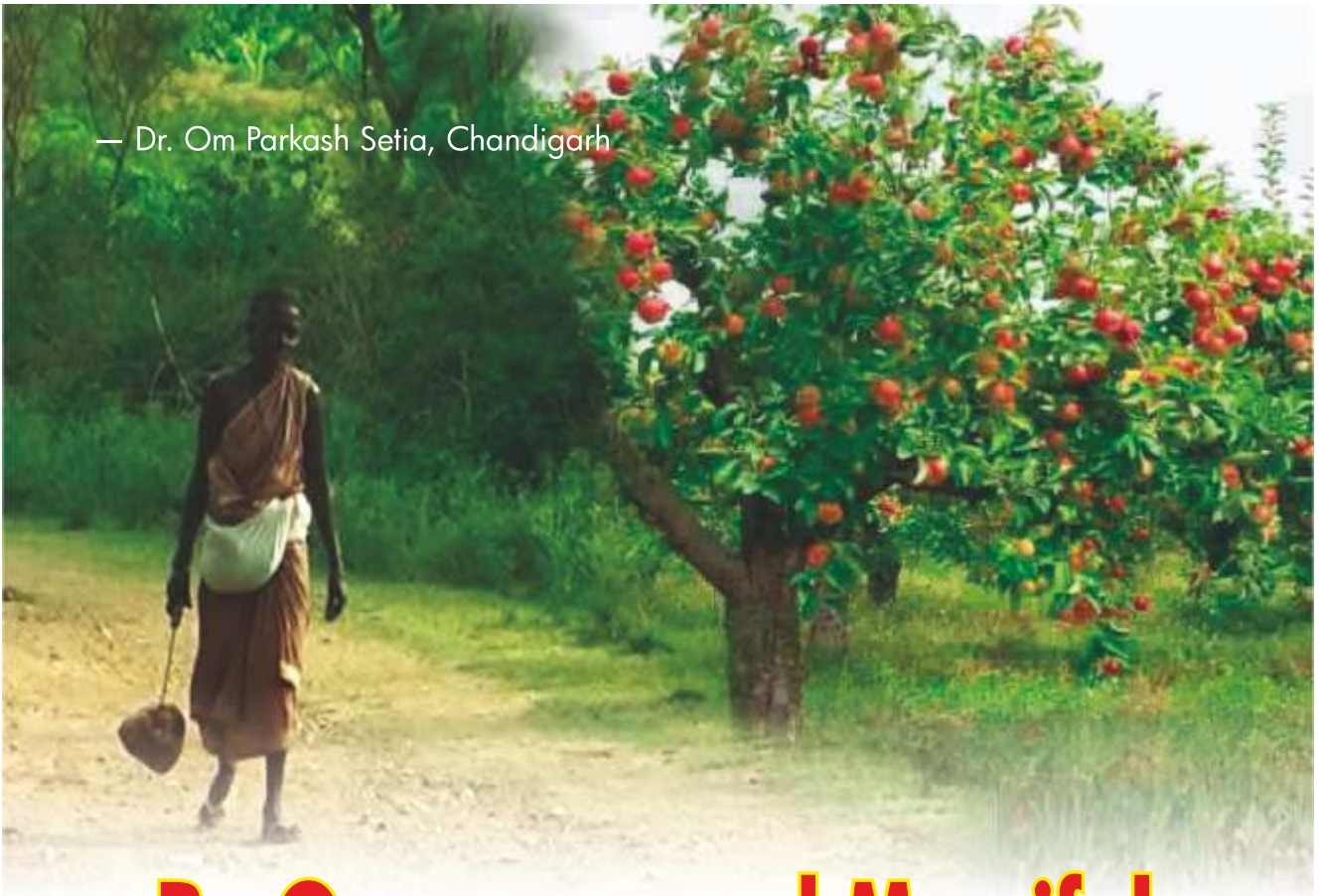

How Monsoon Arrives

Dear friends! You know it well that for good rains, setting in of good monsoon is required. Monsoons typically occur in tropical areas. One area that monsoons impact greatly is India. In India monsoons create an entire season in which the winds reverse completely.

Various atmospheric conditions influence the monsoon winds. The first condition is the differential heating and cooling of land and water. This creates low pressure on the landmass, while high pressure is created over the seas during daytime, but is reversed during the night time.

The second condition is the shift in the position of Inter-Tropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ). In summer, the equatorial trough normally positioned about 5°N of the equator moves over the Ganga plain creating a monsoon trough during the monsoon season.

The third condition is the presence of the high-pressure area that develops east of Madagascar. It is approximately at 20°S over the Indian Ocean. The intensity and position of this high-pressure area affects the Indian Monsoon.

The fourth condition develops during the summer. The Tibetan Plateau gets intensely heated resulting in strong vertical air currents and high pressure over the plateau about 9 km above sea level. The fifth condition develops during the summer due to the movement of the westerly jet streams to the north of the Himalayas and the presence of the tropical easterly jet stream over the Indian Peninsula.

Changes in pressure over the southern oceans also affect the monsoons. In certain years, there is a reversal in the pressure conditions. This periodic change in pressure conditions is known as the Southern Oscillation, or SO.

The Southern Oscillation is connected to El Nino, which is a warm ocean current that flows past the Peruvian Coast. It flows every two to five years in place of the cold Peruvian current. The phenomenon is, referred to as ENSO (El Nino Southern Oscillations). In India, the monsoon lasts for 100 to 120 days from early June and to mid-September. The monsoon winds encounter various atmospheric conditions





on their way and hence are pulsating in nature, and not steady.

The monsoon arrives with a sudden downpour of rainfall that continues for several days. This is known as the 'burst' of the monsoon.

The rainfall is a result of the convergence of wind flow from the Bay of Bengal and reverse winds from the South China Sea. The onset of the monsoon occurs over the Bay of Bengal in May, arriving at the Indian Peninsula by June, and then the winds move towards the South China Sea.] By early September, the monsoon starts to withdraw or retreat and is a more gradual process. By mid-October, it

withdraws completely from the northern half of the peninsula. The withdrawal takes place progressively from north to south from the first week of December to the first week of January. This is the start of the winter season.

The retreating monsoon winds move over the Arabian Sea and the Bay of Bengal, and collect moisture on the way. These monsoon winds reach the southern states of India by October, and are responsible for a second round of rainfall. These are called the winter monsoons. The winter monsoon is experienced in the states of Karnataka, Tamil Nadu, Kerala and Andhra Pradesh in the first week of January.

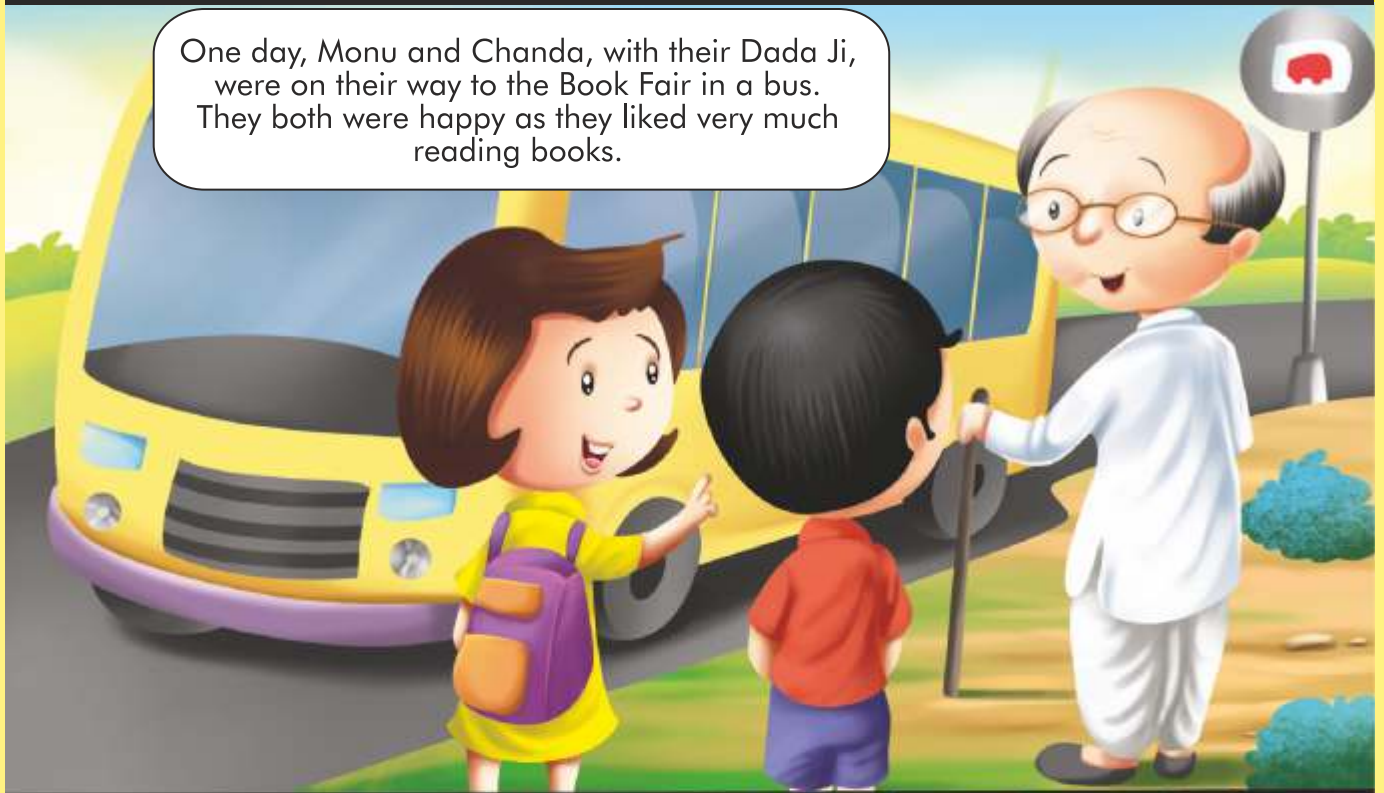

Monu said, "I have read about first-aid treatments in a book. Get me some water quickly. Let her be given a seat. Open the windows so that air reaches her."



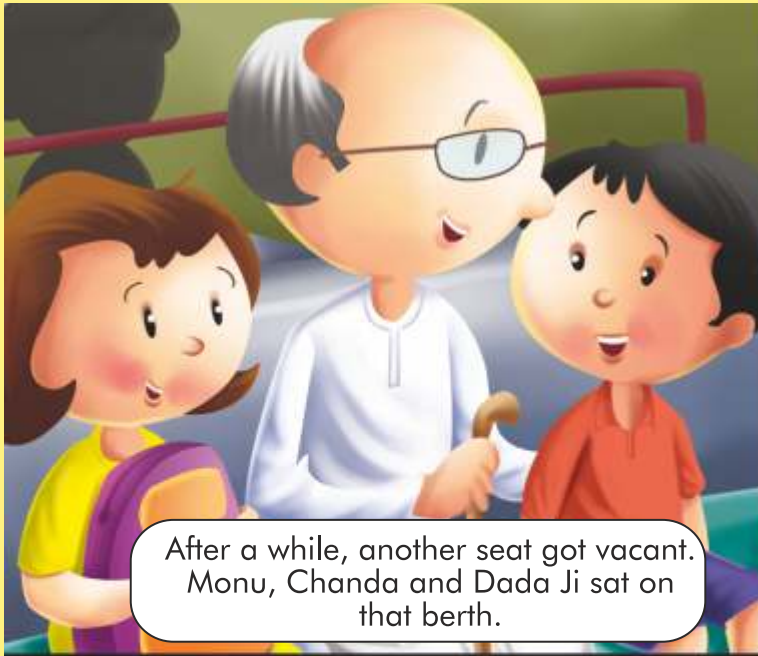
"Look, she is gaining sense." Chanda had some oranges and offered one to the child. The child felt better.



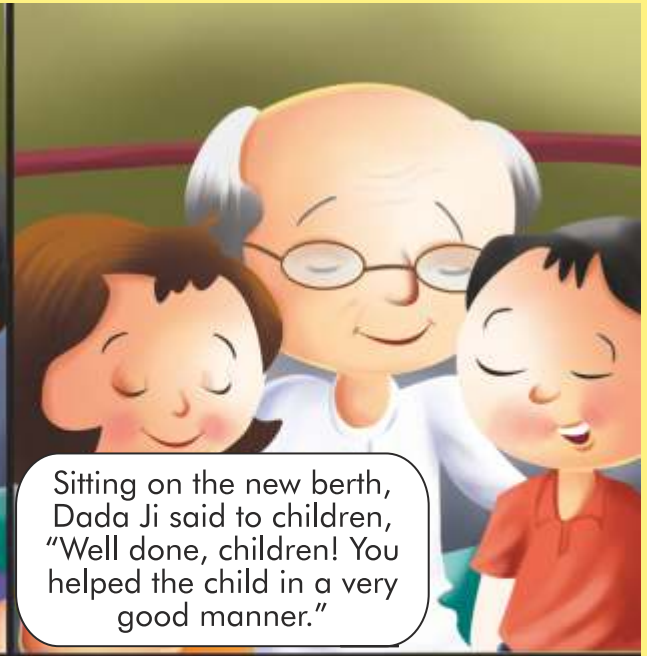
Monu and Chanda started playing with the child.



Seeing this, the parents of the child thanked both of them. "How lovely are the children? May God give you a long life."



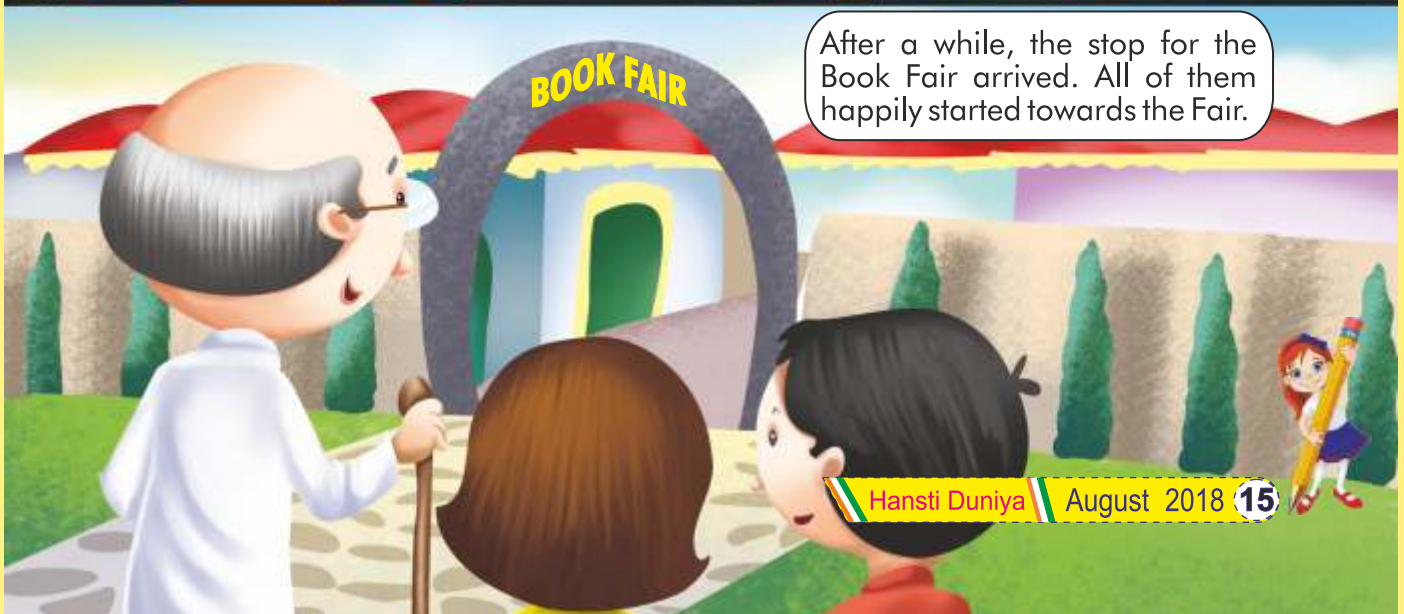
After a while, another seat got vacant. Monu, Chanda and Dada Ji sat on that berth.



Sitting on the new berth, Dada Ji said to children, "Well done, children! You helped the child in a very good manner."



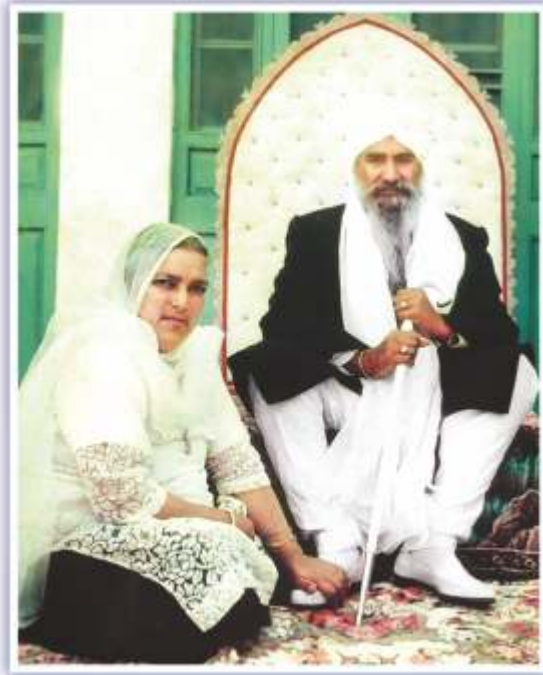
"Children! We should always be ready like that to help needy people."

Jagatmata Buddhwanti Ji

A Dedicated Life



Rev. Buddhwanti Ji was born in the family of Shri Lakshman Das Kochhar Ji and Mata Gurdei Ji on 15 August, 1904 at Neela Gaon, Chaktal, Jhelum (now in Pakistan).

With the passage of time, she was married to Rev. Avtar Singh Ji. Her saintly qualities like innocence, simplicity, love and heart of gold embellished her married life. She became a dutiful and cooperative wife of Baba Avtar Singh Ji and ideal mother of Rev. Gurbachan Singh Ji.

On 15 August 1964, during the course of a one-day camp of Sewadal organized at Sant Nirankari Colony, Jagatmata Ji renounced her body and merged in Nirankar. Rendering selfless service was the aim of Jagatmata Ji's life. And even during the last moments of her life, she explained to volunteers about their duties. Teen ready to write New Chapter in Life

With Father's Monthly Income A Measly BEFORE
8,000, His Fight For Prosthetic Limb Wasn't Easy AFTER



Section 17 (g) of the Act stipulates that the appropriate government and the local authorities shall take measure for providing books, other learning materials and “appropriate assistive devices” to students with benchmark disabilities for free up to the age of 18.

Agarwal had argued that Ritik, a Class XII student at Heera Lal Jain Senior Secondary School, had 100% disability. The lawyer said RTE provides for persons with disabilities to avail benefits for the purpose of education.

“The right to education is a fundamental right. So, the means required to achieve and materialise the right are also covered by the Act,” the PIL had stated.

For the family, however, the battle for getting Ritik to get prosthetic arm from Govt. was a battle. Till a few days ago, Ritik used his toes for writing, sketching and cartooning, his favourite hobby. Now, he uses the arm to write a few numbers, even if it means a few failed attempts. The court — both inside and outside the court — has been a testing one. It faced multiple rejections from all corners, including more than a dozen schools refusing to give Ritik admission. His father, Mahender, is the sole bread winner for the family and earns a meagre Rs 8,000 monthly.

“For getting a prosthetic arm, we knocked on doors of several hospitals. Our efforts took us even to Rajasthan, but there too we faced rejection,” said his mother Usha, while trying to fit the new arm on his son.

It takes some effort at the moment for Ritik, a naturally gifted artist, to move the artificial arm. Till a few days ago, he used his toes for writing, sketching and cartooning, his favourite hobby. He uses the arm to write a few numbers, even if it means a few failed attempts and beads of sweat dotting his forehead. Getting the right grip for now is a challenge, but when he does get the grip, he goes on jotting down numbers, his name — all with total abandon.

Ever since the boy got his new arm at VIMHANS on June 23, Ritik has been practicing to use it for at least a couple of hours every day. Mastering movements is in no way easy, but Ritik is determined to make the best use of it. The boy is soon slated to get another prosthetic limb for the other arm.

During the hearing on November 1, 2017, the high court was informed that Dr J C Passey of the LokNayak Hospital had written to the Delhi government about the money for the prosthetic limb to be made available through Delhi ArogyaKosh.

The letter also stated that the limb would be fitted within two months. The HC had accordingly disposed of the matter and ordered for abiding by the contents of the letter.

Though Ritik got the limb fitted only a few days ago, he wants others like him also not to get discouraged. “I never got disheartened, never lost hope. All I need to worry about now is to keep my arm away from water,” he said.

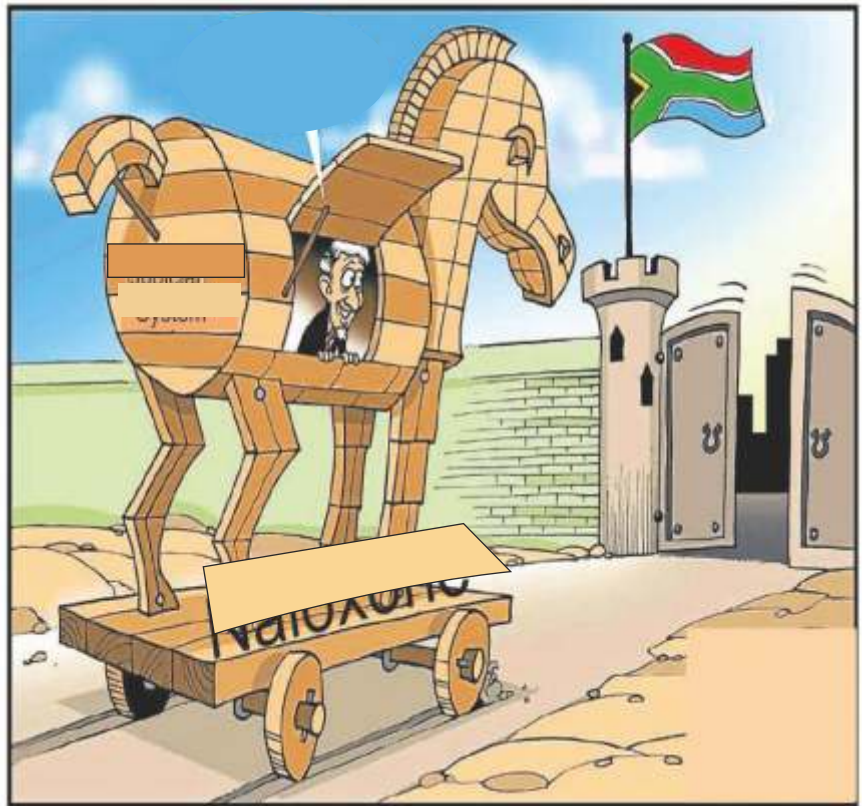
The Trojan Horse

And often they got upset because

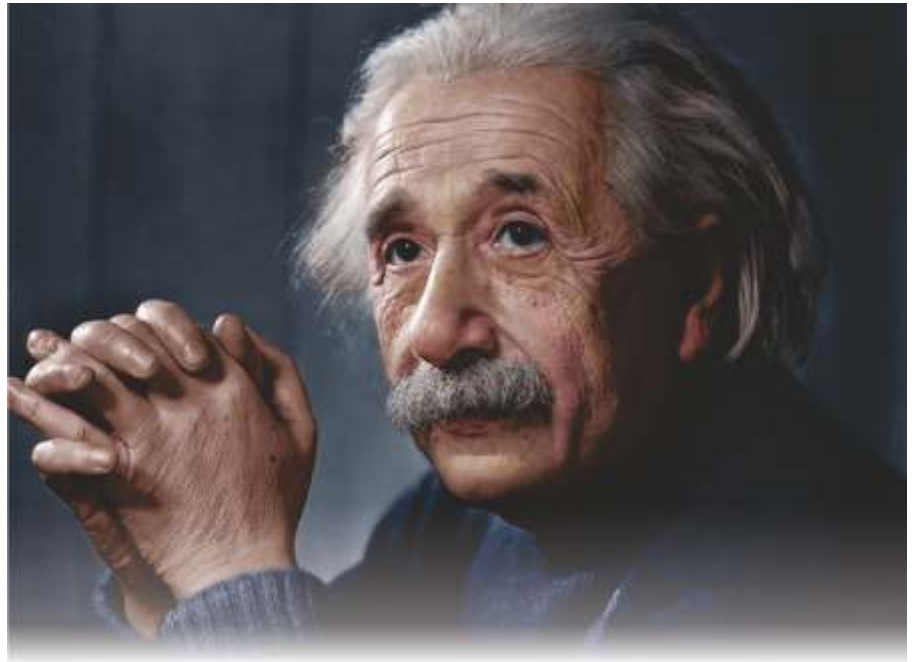
Albert thought of questions they couldn't answer.

The Water Bird SWAN

The nature has created various types of creatures on this earth and one of them is 'swan'. Though the swans fly also, but these are called water birds because they spend most of their life in cool water only.

Swan is the biggest water bird of Anatidae family. It has some eight species, out of which five are white. There is one such species of swan which is called 'low spoken swan'. The swan of this species, sometimes do hissing or produce low sound from the nose. Dumb swan came to North America from Europe. Generally, these can be seen in park lakes or in small ponds. White swans are found in northern regions. The Swan found in Western Canada or Northern America can be up to 100cm long. The length of Trumpet swan is more than this up to 115cm and spread of wings can be up to 225cm. Black swan species are found in Australia. Similarly, orange legged swans are found in Southern America.

Swans have got long neck, wide claws and heavy body. Male and female swans apparently look alike. Swans swimming in water look great. Generally, they swim



in pairs. They swim in water dipping their beaks in water, touching their heads and dancing. The male and female swans produce different voices or whistling sound.

Swans are expert in flying also, but they glide while swimming and then fly, means first they run on surface of water and then fly.

Female swan at once delivers 5-6 eggs which are of yellow colour. Instead of making nest, they keep their eggs on the heap of grass and the male swan takes care of these eggs. When little ones of swan come out of the eggs, then within a little time they start swimming in water.

Swans have long life. In forest climate though they live for 20 years, but the pet swan can live up to 50 years. The plants growing on water surface or below it serve their food.

Swans have a capacity to fly at 108 km per hour. They fly the highest also. Once an aircraft pilot saw a group of 30 swans coming from Iceland at a height of 8230 meter. These swans could be seen on radar screen also.

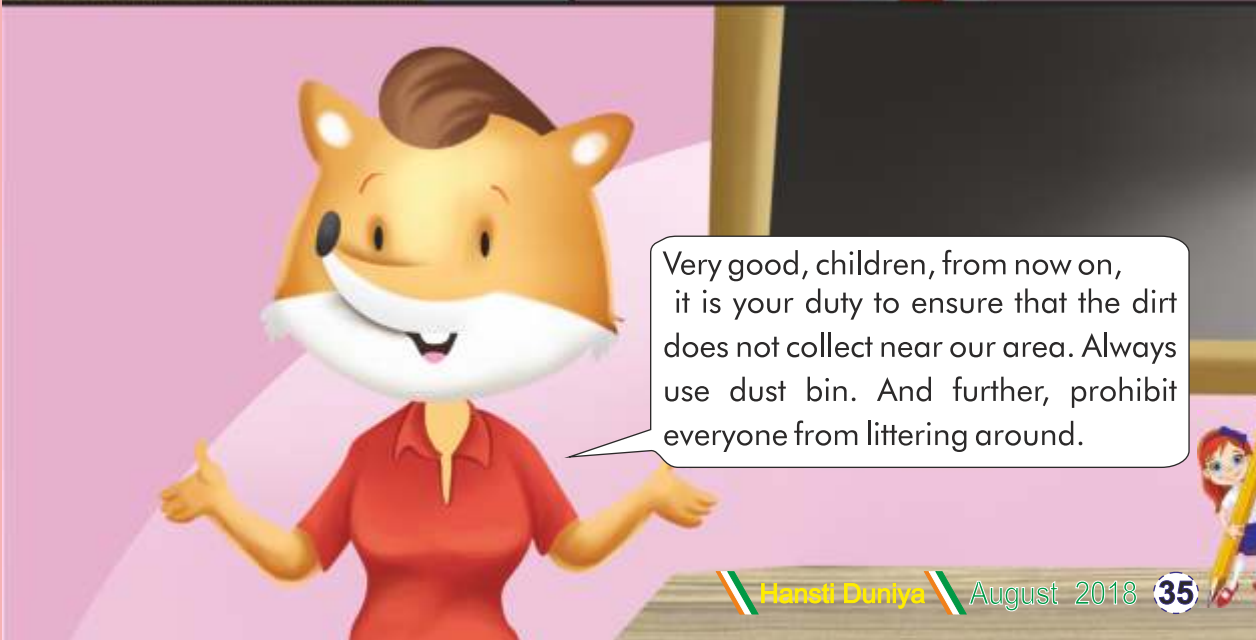

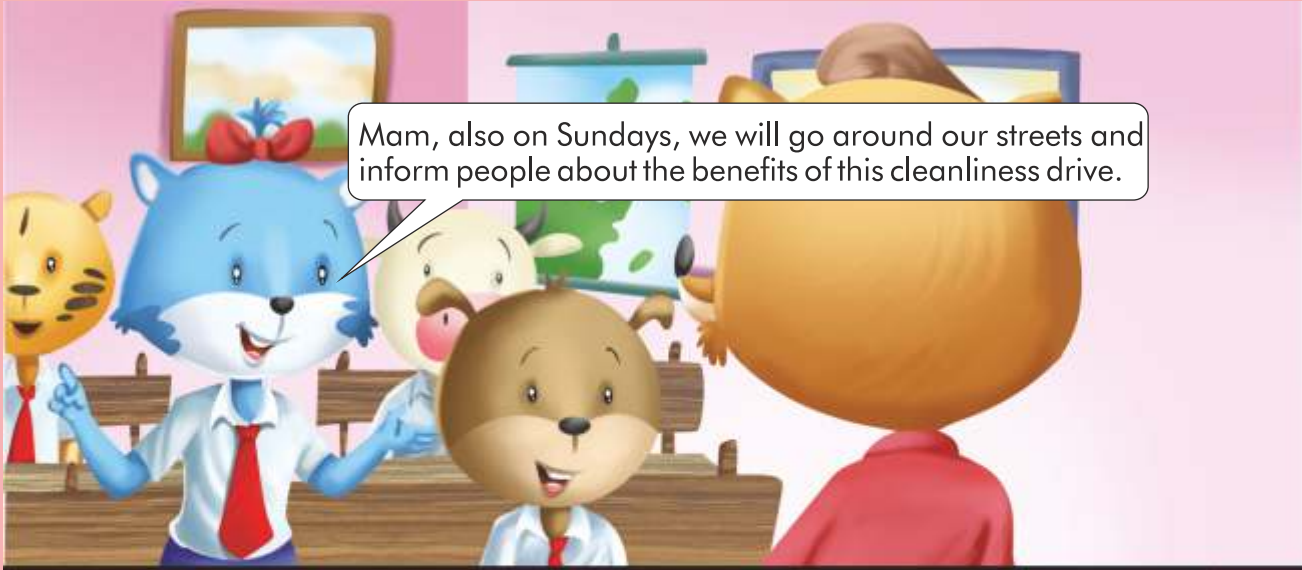

Kalu was awarded for his presence of mind and courage. It was a matter of joy for the entire Champak Jungle.

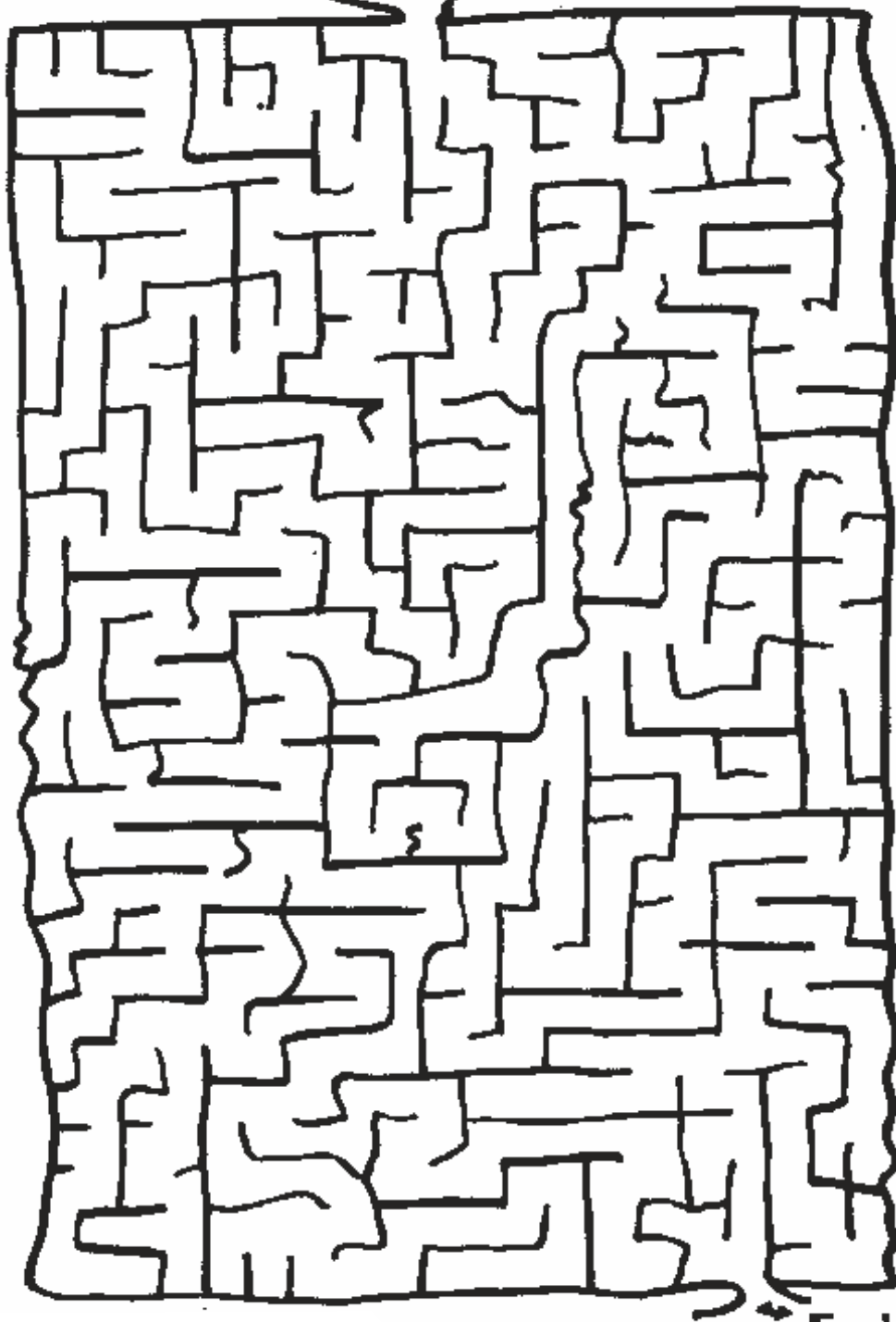

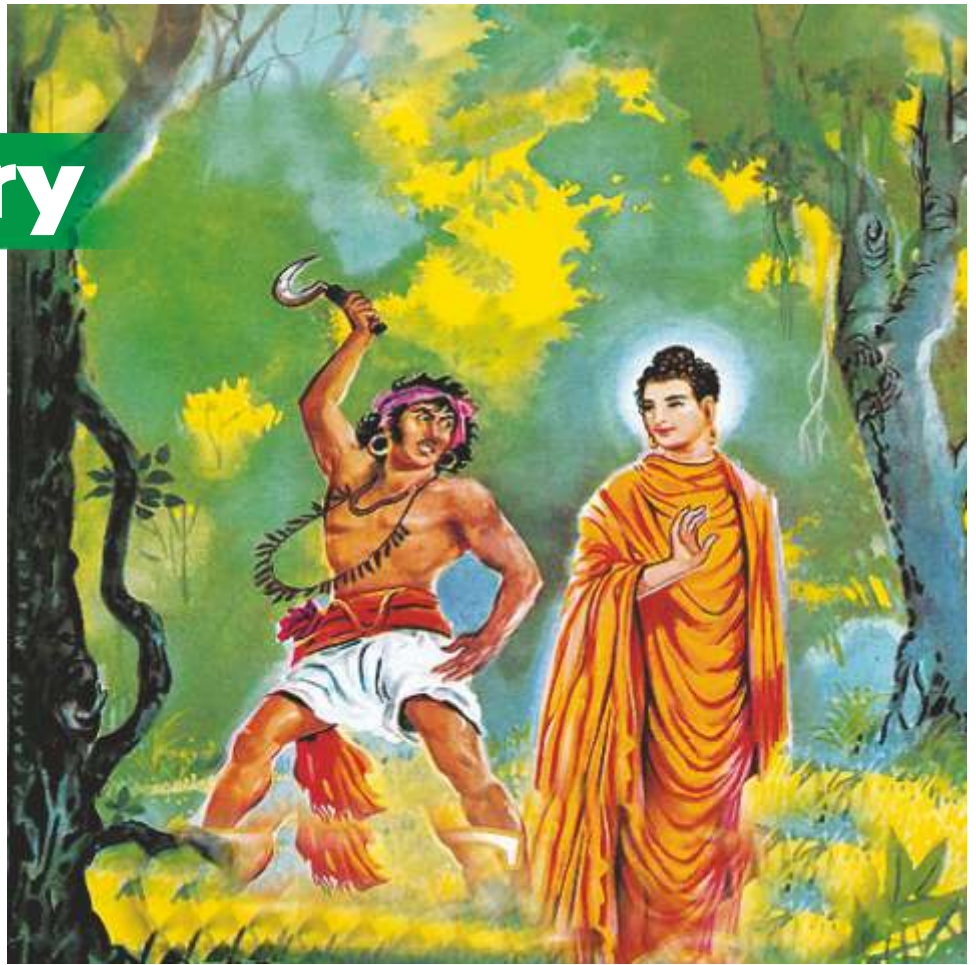
