# Divine Personage Nirankari Mata Savinder Hardev Ji Maharaj

"To re-establish the essence of Universal Brotherhood, it is important for mankind to fell all walls of caste, race, color, cultures and religion etc., embracing the inequalities and differences with the divine virtues of Love, Compassion, Tolerance and Magnanimity. This alone is the way to Bliss and Peace."

Satguru Mata Savinder Hardev Ji Maharaj took over as the Spiritual Head of the Mission on 17 May 2016, with all the rich heritage of Truth, Love and Harmony. This is a rare example of woman empowerment in the spiritual domain of history. "Weaving spiritual threads in the same pattern, Her Holiness Mata Ji reiterated, "The world needs to be united as a family, tolerating accepting and loving each other, keeping in mind the watch word "Godfidence", having complete faith and confidence in God.

Mata Savinder Hardev Ji was born on 12 January 1957 in the family of Shri Manmohan Singh Ji Anand and Mata Amrit Kaur Ji residing in Delhi. Later, die family was shifted to Yamuna Nagar. The child Savinder was however, adopted and brought up by Shri Gurmukh Singh Ji and Madan Mata Ji belonging to Farrukhabad in Uttar Pradesh. They had no child of their own. The two families were related to each other and both the families were closely associated with the Sant Nirankari Mission. They sought the blessings of the then head of the Mission, Shehanshah Baba Avtar Singh Ji, which made this emotional arrangement a divine destiny for the child Savinder.

Savinder Ji took her primary education in Farrukhabad. In 1966 she was sent to an Irish institution, the Convent of Jesus and Mary in Waverly, Mussoorie from where she passed the Indian School Certificate Examination (Senior Cambridge, equivalent to Senior Secondary), in 1973.

At school, Savinder Ji was a brilliant student. Her school teachers-Ms P. Das and Mrs. Beena Bhardwaj recall the days of her childhood and say that she was a very intelligent and hardworking student and won the hearts of all the nuns and teachers because of her polite and respectful behavior. She joined Daulat Ram College, Delhi for higher education.

She was married to Baba Hardev Singh Ji at a simple ceremony on the eve of the 28th Annual Nirankari Sant Samagam in Delhi on 14 November 1975 and became an integral part of the holy family of Baba Gurbachan Singh Ji and Nirankari Rajmata Kulwant Kaur Ji, as their gracious daughter-in-law. They took the young couple with them on their month long world salvation tour in December, 1975, which covered UK, Italy, Switzerland, France, Belgium and Austria. Again in 1976, Savinder Ji and Baba Hardev Singh Ji accompanied Baba Gurbachan Singh Ji and Rajmata Ji on a two months world salvation tour that took them to Kuwait, Iraq, Thailand, Hong Kong, Canada, USA, Austria and UK. These two tours were a great source of learning on how to serve the True Master.



When Baba Hardev Singh Ji took over the responsibility as the Spiritual Head of the Sant Nirankari Mission in 1980, Savinder Ji started being addressed by Nirankari world as Pujya Mata Savinder Ji. She shared the dais with Baba Ji and Rajmata Ji and moved shoulder to shoulder with Baba Ji during all his salvation tours in India and abroad. She looked after the visitors as any devoted housewife would do in the case of close relations and important guests. They had three daughters- Samta Ji, Renuka Ji and Sudiksha Ji, but her love and care for them never came in the way to serve the Mission along with Baba Ji.

Her Holiness Mata Savinder Hardev Ji has always been kind to Sewadars. She bestowed her motherly love and care not only on them but their families too. She blessed the brides and bridegrooms at mass-marriages so that they find all that's needed to make their married life happy, prosperous and blissful.

Her Holiness has always encouraged the devotees towards service of humanity by participating in the same herself. She donated her blood along with Babaji at the launching of voluntary blood donation movement by the Mission in Delhi on 24 April 1986, organized on Manav Ekta Diwas to commemorate the supreme sacrifice of Baba Gurbachan Singh Ji and hundreds of devotees who laid down their lives while crusading for truth, love, tolerance and unity. It is now an annual feature making the Mission a leading donor of blood globally.

On 5 June 2009, the International Environment Day, Pujya Mata Ji led a special cleanliness drive in Mussoorie



where Safai Karamcharis of the Municipal Corporation had gone on strike. In December the same year, she visited the Tihar Jail in Delhi and distributed gifts among women and children. She showed such gestures towards them on several occasions. On 26 October 2014, Mata ji joined the Run for Oneness from National Stadium to Connaught Place in Delhi which served as a great source of inspiration for thousands of men and women participating in the event.

Kindness and compassion remained ingrained in her heart. This was the reason that she always emphasized on tolerance. It was in her nature to motivate devotees for devotion to Satguru. Mataji wanted to see





her devotees leading their lives as true disciples, in accordance with the five pledges and Divine-Knowledge. Satguru Mataji said that we should take care to wear dignified simple dress in satsang. She wanted to see the children and youth to grow in the sangat. Satguru Mata Ji wanted women to progress in each and every field just as they are putting in great efforts for worldly achievement, in the same way they should also devote their time and energy in spiritual field. We must work

Of course lesser known are her generous donations to the marginalized Hindi medium School. The Nirankari ambulance is her contribution to the Queen of Hills. Mussoorie shall miss her





gentle presence always. (This being the News Post from Mussoorie, Uttarakhand).

On taking over the reins of the Mission, Her Holiness undertook countrywide tours starting from Chandigarh, Haryana and distant states like Maharashtra, Telangana, West Bengal, Odisha, Andhra Pradesh, Tamilnadu, Karnataka, Uttarakhand, Uttar Pradesh, Punjab, Sikkim etc. She also blessed devotees across the country in Nepal, America, Canada, England and Gulf countries.

During 69th and 70th Annual Sant Samagams in Delhi, she was a source of inspiration for the global gathering receiving blessings. Baba Hardev Singh Ji's teachings became a household word and she made it possible to compile his invaluable

thoughts in the form of "Sampooran Hardev Bani" and released the same on the occasion of 70th Samagam for the benefit of the society at large.

At the initiative of Satguru Mata Savinder Hardev Ji Maharaj, the construction and development of Nirankari Spiritual Complex, Samalkha was inaugurated on 14 January 2018 on the occasion of Bhakti Parv Samagam







which is in progress for holding of 71st Annual Samagam in November 2018.

Keeping in mind her socio-spiritual activities for uplift of humanity, Satguru Mata Savinder Hardev Ji was greeted as Ambassador for Peace by the Universal Peace Federation, North America and the Inter-religious and International Federation of World Peace. Further she was given "Service to Humanity" Award 2017 by the Life Chiropractic College West organization California USA. America based organization. "We Care for Humanity"



recognized Satguru Mata Savinder Hardev Ji as "2018 Supreme Spiritual Icon of the Year" in Kolkata (India) on 29-07-2018 aiming to honour the 'Greatest Humanitarian of the World with G.O.D. Award.

As Shchanshah Baba Avtar Singh Ji had handed over the reins of Nirankari Mission to Baba Gurbachan Singh Ji during his life time on 3 December 1962, repeating the history and reviving the Mission of Shehanshah Ji, Satguru Mata Savinder Hardev Ji also relinquished her responsibilities to Rev Sudiksha Ji on 16 July 2018 and seated her on Divine chair of Satguru after applying 'Tilak' on her forehead in the presence of huge gathering of Nirankari devotees on 17 July 2018.

Mata Savinder Hardev Ji merged into Almighty Nirankar on 5 August 2018 at her residence, Sant Nirankari Satsang Bhawan, Sant Nirankari Colony, Delhi-9. Though she spread the message of Truth of Sant Nirankari Mission as Spiritual Head of the Mission for about two years only, she actually helped spreading this light of divinity continuously to every nook and corner of the world for 36 years along with Baba Hardev Singh ji.

## Biographic Introduction

# Satguru Mata Sudiksha Ji Maharaj

Sudiksha Ji was born on 13<sup>th</sup> March 1985 in the family of Baba Hardev Singh Ji and Pujiya Mata Savinder Ji at Sant Nirankari Colony, Delhi. As a child she received lots of love from Holy parents, Grandmother Nirankari Rajmata Ji, maternal grandparents Rev. Daddy Gurmukh Singh Ji and Mata Madan Kaur Ji in whose care she grew up since birth. It is worth mentioning that Sudiksha Ji was born after Hardev Singh Ji was bestowed with the mantle of being the Master of Sant Nirankari Mission. Sudiksha Ji started receiving Spiritual nurturing when she was only a few months old. Satguru Baba Ji took her along on World Salvation Tour where she got love and affection from devotees of the Mission overseas also. She has been an apple of her sister's eyes who would sing a lullaby for her, "*Samta Renuka Ki Behna, Sudiksha Ka Kya Kehna.*" With her growth, started growing thoughtfulness and sobriety of child Sudiksha. With the impact of

regular presence in congregation, respect and regards for elders and trait of humility could be noticed conspicuously in her. She would study, play, spend time with friends and keep a balance between modernity and ethical teachings of Satguru.

Coming Events Cast their shadows before After schooling, she did her graduation in Psychology and also started contributing to the activities of



Sant Nirankari Mission in the form of Sewadal Member and attending to saints visiting Satguru Babaji. She was notably active in Children's Congregations, English Medium Congregations and regular mass drives in Tree Plantation and Cleanliness. Inheriting divine virtues, Rev. Sudiksha Ji has been an epitome of love, mercy and compassion from the very childhood which could be seen from her dealings and doings in daily course of life. To quote a few instances:

At the age of 12, Sudiksha Ji accompanied by Sister Renuka Ji visited Human Resources and Allied Sciences Institution in Dilshad Garden Delhi where mental patients are treated. Interested to know their life style, they were taking a round when a young person in tattered clothes and worn out shoes with sunken face came across. Seeing him, Purshotam Ji, a devotee of that area, who was escorting them uttered "Tuhi Nirankar" (One Thou Formless God!) Hearing this, that person also started repeating loudly, "Tu hi Nirankar-2" adding, "I am hungry".

Sudiksha Ji gazed at him and felt strongly to take him home for proper care. This gesture shows her feeling of compassion towards a suffering patient. The person was brought to Nirankari Colony where Sudksha Ji asked Satguru Babaji to bless the patient and arrange for his return to his family in U.P. Sudiksha Ji followed this case closely and ensured his return home within a fortnight to join his family. This

matter highlights sublime kindness of Rev. Sudikhsa Ji which redeemed the miserable life of that person.

While child Sudiksha was growing into a youngster with all dreams and aspirations, there was something that was triggering a different thought process in her mind. Sitting at a restaurant, she would suddenly stop eating because she saw a hungry person on the street through glass window. She would find ways on how she can get the eatables to that person. She uniquely combined the honesty of a child, energy of a teenager, the maturity of an adult and curiosity of a true human being.

As she saw deaths and sufferings all around, she questioned as to why GOD should do this. It was here that she went to Baba Hardev Singh Ji and asked, "Babaji, why are there suffering and tears in this world?" to which Babaji replied, "GOD is inviting you to take the challenge and contribute to the effort to minimize this suffering. Do not look at death and destruction but look at what can be done by you to bring consolation". It is not about worrying about the suffering, it is about 'being together in the suffering' – it is not about removing the tears, it is about sharing the tears. Sudiksha was now realizing that Godliness is not in complaints; but in the belief 'Thy Will be done'. A classic example of Sudiksha's submission to the Will of God is the event when Satguru



Baba Hardev Singh Ji and dedicated devotee Avneet Setya Ji departed the world in physical form suddenly due to an accident in May 2016. The entire Nirankari world was drowned in deep grief. For Sudiksha Ji, it was a great loss. She had lost her Guru, her father and even her life partner. But, despite of all this, the divinity in Sudiksha Ji withstood the challenging circumstances, accepting the divine verdict with complete faith and humility. She maintained composure, also comforting and proving a source of solace to others.

After Baba Hardev Singh Ji, Satguru Mata Savinder Hardev Ji Maharaj took over as the head of Sant Nirankari Mission. Sudiksha Ji was entrusted with the enormous duty to handle the 220 foreign branches of the mission, spread over around 70 countries across the globe. She diligently performed her role in this department and guided the youth & sadh sangat in overseas branches. It is with her initiative and support that an incredible spiritual summit, NSS (Nirankari Spiritual Summit) was organized in Houston, Texas on 30<sup>th</sup> June-1<sup>st</sup> July 2018, where devotees from entire North America gathered to share the teachings of the mission. A Guinness World Record was also established on the occasion.

Sudiksha Ji also initiated a video program spiritual motivation of the kids, called Kids Divine. The program which

was launched on 23<sup>rd</sup> February 2017 by Satguru Mata Savinder Hardev Ji Maharaj has been instrumental in connecting the children with the history and ideology of Nirankari Mission in an interesting way.

It was 15 July, 2018 when Mata Savinder Hardev Ji called her enlightened devotee Sudiksha Ji and told her that she wanted something from her. Sudiksha Ji happily nodded and said "Satguru Mata Ji, what can I give you?" Satguru said 'I want Sudiksha from Sudiksha'. Silence followed, tears came out both from the eyes of Satguru and her trusted devotee Sudiksha. Satguru was asking Sudiksha to give her youth, her dreams, her passions, her aspirations as she was to become the next Spiritual Head of the Mission who would simply live for service of others. A humble Sudiksha bowed in reverence unto the holy feet of the Satguru, and folded her hands in the affirmative. Young Sudiksha became Satguru Mata Sudiksha Ji Maharaj. With this, Her joyous smile became a smile of blessing; Her eyes were conveying everyone 'I am there ....don't worry – Put your entire burden on me...I am there" This promising atmosphere is noted as a mark of millennium.

As Sudiksha was 33, she was getting re-born as a sincere devotee, committed human who wanted to share everyone's concern. Identified with the Mission, evincing absorbing interest for its





globalization, Satguru Mata Savinder Hardev Ji Maharaj declared her as the Spiritual Head of Sant Nirankari Mission from 16 July 2018. Her Holiness Satguru Sudiksha Ji accepted the new responsibility as a divine blessing. She prayed and sought collective cooperation of all so that she takes every step, from first to the last, as per expectations of Satguru and serves the entire humanity with utmost humility. She adds further that the enlightened people are citizen of the world. "Patriotism, the love of one's country is a splendid thing. But why should love stop at the border? Border is not a dividing line, but the meeting line. There is nothing that love cannot achieve, and there is nothing that love cannot sacrifice. Loving is living. When we stop loving, we stop living. To understand the power of intellectual globalization, the idea of patriotism itself militates against the intense consciousness of the separateness of one's own people from others."

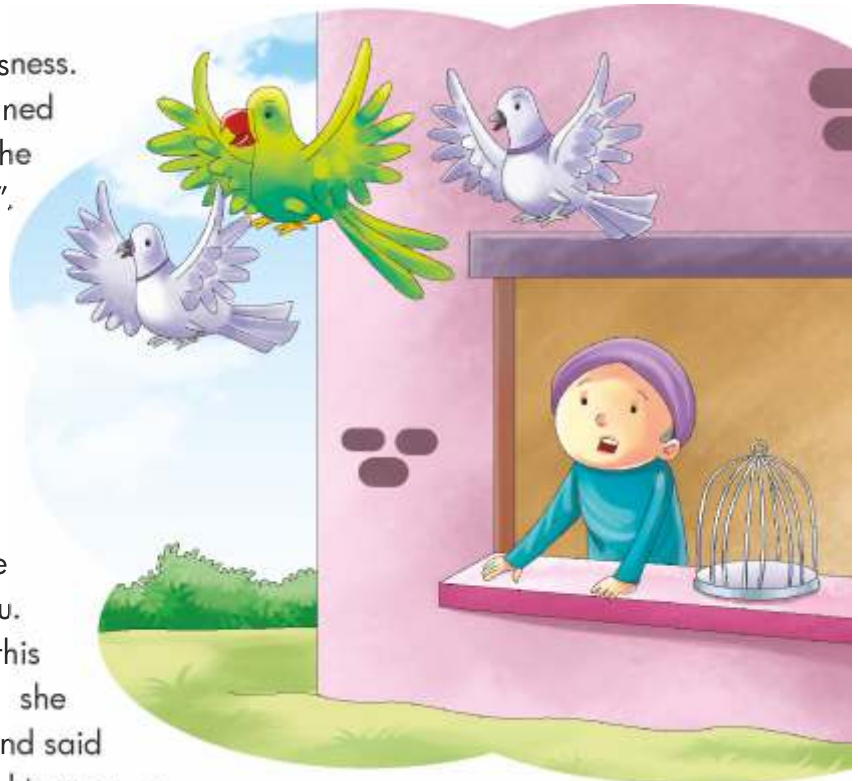

How can I help you? I am also a small bird like you

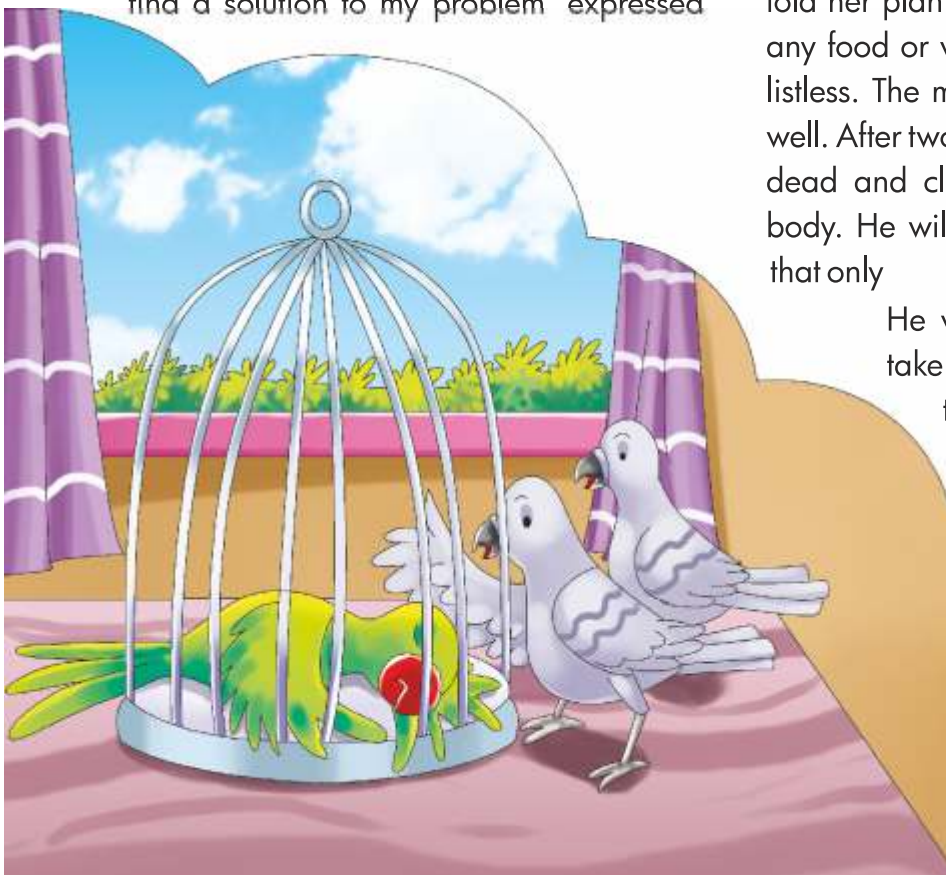
-the pigeon showed his helplessness.

She felt very happy and proud. When she got home she called, "Mother, Father, I found a home for every single kitten, aren't you glad?"





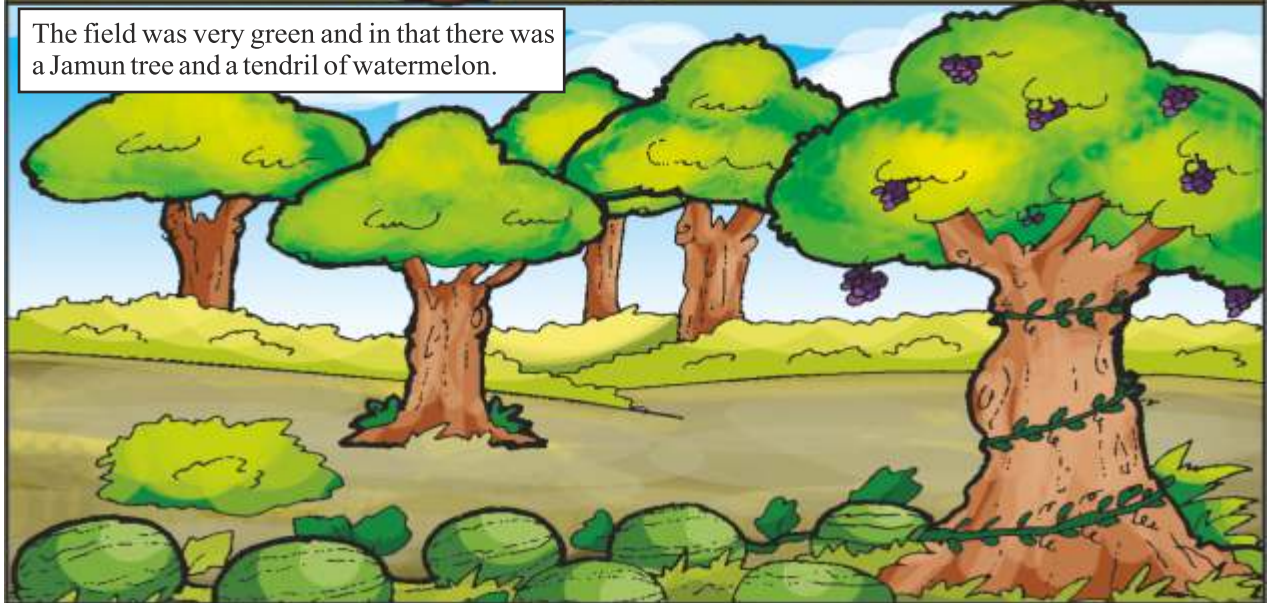
