They again appeared before the saint and requested him to accept the coins. But this time too the helpers returned with the same answer.




One day, the saint said to the king, "O'king! today I'll make gold for you, so tell me how much you want."

What to Keep in Mind while Starting a Herb Garden

- There's nothing like growing veggies at home and having them fresh. And since herbs are the easiest and quickest to grow, here are a few tips you could keep in mind when starting a herb garden.
- Make sure to buy herbs from a nursery, not the ones you get in the markets, as they'll have a hard time growing if you plant them outside.
- If you have a smaller space, then consider growing parsley, oregano and basil. They can grow in pots and window boxes too.
- Know that it is important to find herbs a sunny spot and well-drained soil for proper growth.
- Make sure that your planters have sufficient drainage holes.
- Herbs like mint and horse radish grow and spread rapidly. So it is better to keep them in segmented containers or individual pots.

The Bharat Ratna was instituted as an award by the first President, Rajendra Prasad, in 1954. Eminent physicist CV Raman, Dr. S Radhakrishnan and C Rajagopalachari, the last Governorgeneral of India, and the only Indian to hold that post, became the first recipients that year. It is the highest civilian award in the country and has so far been conferred on 41 people.

What exactly does the award consist of?

It is a peepal leaf inscribed with an image of the sun and the words "Bharat Ratna" in the Devanagari script on one side and the national emblem and motto "Satyameva Jayate" on the other side. In the official "order of precedence", Bharat Ratna awardees are placed in the same category as former PMs, current cabinet ministers, the current leader of the opposition in both Houses of Parliament, CMs and the deputy chairman of the planning commission.

For what is the award given?

The award is given for 'exceptional service towards advancement of art, literature and science and in recognition of public service of the highest order'. The way this has been interpreted has in practice meant that the vast majority of the 41 recipients so far have been politicians. Since there is nothing which specifies that the award must only be given to Indian citizens, it has been awarded to Khan Abdul Ghaffar Khan and to Nelson Mandela as well as to Mother Teresa, who was a naturalised citizen.

What is the periodicity of the award?

There is no fixed periodicity. There have been years in which more than one person has received the award and others in which nobody has got it. The last person to get the award was, in fact, Bhimsen Joshi in 2008. Between July 1977 and January 1980, when the Janta Party government was in office, it had suspended the award.

Has anybody refused the award?

Yes, Maulana Abul Kalam Azad was offered the award but declined on the grounds that those who had been on the selection panel should not be given it. However, the Bharat Ratna was ultimately conferred on him posthumously in 1992. This apart, the award given to Netaji S C Bose, also in 1992, had to be withdrawn after a PIL in the SC challenged the posthumous nature of the award saying the selection committee could not prove that Netaji was dead. *





Magnificent India -Chandrayaan- 3 " This is the work of a generation of ISRO scientists." ISRO Chairman S Somnath

(ISRO — Indian Space Research Organization) A new chapter was added in India's history raising the dreams and wishes of every Indian with the safe landing of Chandrayaan-3 at the surface of moon's south pole on August 23, 2023 at 18:04 IST.

Chandrayan 3 is a space vehicle launched by India on July 14 ,2023. The vehicle consisted of three parts: Lander, Rover and Propulsion module.

Propulsion module: Propulsion module is a component or system in a vehicle or spacecraft designed specially for providing the necessary thrust or propulsion to propel the vehicle forward or take it in the desired direction in space (LMV3- Launch Vehicle Mark-3).

Lander : Lander was named 'Vikram' symbolising courage and named after Dr Vikram Sarabhai who is recognised as the father of Indian space programs. Lander is a spacecraft that lands softly and then stays there and does all other functions which it has to do.

Rover named 'Pragyan' meaning wisdom in Sanskrit. Pragyan is designed to obtain important data from Moon's surface.


Chandrayan 3 was launched on July 14 with the help of propulsion module (LMV3) at Sriharkota. On August 5,2023 it got inserted in the orbit.

On August 17 the Lander and Rover successfully detached from the propulsion module.

After a duration of 41 days the journey ended at 18:04 on 23rd August 2023. It landed softly at the south pole of moon. (Softlycontrolled landing during which no damage happens because of mountainous

south pole of moon) Choosing south pole of moon for landing is interesting because in 2009 the Chandrayaan-1 carried an instrument which made the discovery of water and ice at south pole of moon craters which can support human life.

After a few hours of landing panels on one side of 'Vikram' opened to enable 'Pragyan' to slide down to the surface of moon. It then rolled down and started noting down important data. Coincidentally the landing of Chandrayaan-3 and beginning of day on moon happened simultaneously with the start of day on the moon. So Lander and Rover will have 14 days of sunlight to charge their batteries. Over



the next 14 days equivalent to one day of moon 'Pragyan' will carry out experiments. It can communicate only with 'Lander' that will send information to Chandrayaan-2 orbiter that will pass it on to earth.

The first most important objective of chandraghan 3 was safe landing on the surface of moon. Safe landing was a victory of technology and dedication of scientists working at ISRO. It also aims to conduct experiments on the moon to know the elements present there.

Chandrayaan-3 is not designed for a return journey to earth. After the exploration the equipment will stay there for ever. *





Rameshbabu Praggnanandha

'Magnus Carlson is the genius of this game but Praggnanandha is the rising star'

Rameshbabu Praggnanandha who has won silver medal in the World Chess Championship intends to win the World Chess Championship.

R. Praggnanandha who won the second position winning a silver medal was born on August 10, 2005 in Chennai. His father Ramesh Babu works as a branch manager at TNSC bank while his mother Nagalaxmi is a home maker who goes ialong with her son during the tournaments. His sister Vaishali is also a champion in chess.

Since he started taking too much interest in chess from the age of 3 his Academics took a back seat. But he is known to be a good student who takes keen interest in physical activities too. His IQ is estimated to be 180 which is considered to be a genius level.

In the year 2013 he won the under 8 title to become a FIDE Master. (FIDE-World Chess Federation, it acts as the governing body of international chess competitions). The titles are in the order-FIDE Master International Master Grandmaster. At the age of 10 he became the International Master, youngest at that time.

When he was 12 he became Grandmaster. Grandmaster is the highest title a player can attain. Once achieved the title is held for life.

On February 22 at the age of 16 he was the youngest to defeat the world champion Magnus Carlson. He became the third Indian player to win against Magnus Carlson.

At age of 18 he was the youngest player to reach the chess world cup final. The two games ended in a draw. The match became a tie. The first tie break match was won by Carlson while the second one became a draw. Thus Praggnanandha became a runner up.

Despite success he is a simple boy who belongs to a grounded family. They eat normal south Indian food together when ever they have the opportunity of being together. Victory is celebrated by visiting temple and grandmother's home. His parents consider his success to be a blessing of God. \Leftrightarrow

The red panda (Ailurus fulgens), also known as the lesser panda, is a small mammal native to the eastern Himalayas and southwestern China. Almost 50% of the red panda's habitat is in the Eastern Himalayas. The red panda is slightly larger than a domestic cat with a bear-like body and thick russet fur. It has dense reddish-brown fur with a black belly and legs, white-lined ears, a mostly white muzzle and a ringed tail. They use their long, bushy tails for balance and to cover themselves in winter, presumably for warmth. It is well adapted to climbing due to its flexible joints and curved semiretractile claws. It possesses elongated wrist bones or "false thumbs" used for grasping bamboo.

The red panda inhabits coniferous forests as well as temperate broadleaf and mixed forests, favouring steep slopes with dense bamboo cover close to water sources. It is solitary and largely arboreal. It feeds mainly on bamboo shoots and leaves, but also on fruits and blossoms. The females give birth to litters of up to four cubs.

It is threatened by poaching as well as destruction and fragmentation of habitat due to deforestation The species has been listed as endangered on the IUCN Red List since 2015. It is protected in all range countries Community based conservation programmes have been initiated in Nepal, Bhutan and



northeastern India; in China, it benefits from nature conservation projects. Regional captive breeding programmes for the red panda have been established in zoos around the world. Each year international Red Panda day is celebrated in the month of September to spread awareness and protect the species.

Every year the northeastern state of Sikkim hosts the Red Panda Festival. The winter event features parades, live music and draws tourists and locals alike. It's a joyful celebration named for Sikkim's iconic state animal. In Sikkim, an area of 1341 km2 is allocated as a native habitat for the red pandas and it was found that more than 60% of this place lies on the outskirts of the protected area network. While residents

of Sikkim honour the endangered red panda, they also understand the species is under a growing threat. Climate change is impacting species across the globe and red pandas—with less than 10,000 left in the wild-are not immune. Average temperatures are rising. Within its forests, the red panda occupies habitat within a very narrow temperature range. As temperatures rise, the red panda will need to move to higher elevations to adapt to the changing climate. Human activities are taking a toll on local forests. And unless these forests are secured, red pandas may have an uncertain future in a changing climate. Therefore, it is important to conserve these fuzzy animals as they are an essential part of our ecosystem.*

Super Foods for Keeping Your Bones Healthy



Collards and turnip greens can also be helpful in providing you with your daily Dose of calcium. The alkaline effect of eating a diet rich in these vegetables will

help you to strengthen your bones and promote bone growth by preventing calcium loss. Besides, plant steroils (steroid hormones) are converted to a hormone called calciferol and that aids calcium absorption. *

Children Like To Play






