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
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Editorial




BEINGS




It means he was dreaming. He closed his eyes and turned on his side. The lion's words were still echoing in his ears. •

Saint Parsa examined each stone. He was surprised to see that all the stones in Namdev Ji's fist were Paras.



But a blessing is a bliss that lasts whole lifetime And helps us most, in our difficult time.



Q. Why is seawater salty?

A. The saltiness of the sea comes from minerals. Minerals are washed into the sea from the land by rivers, which dissolve minerals from the rocks over which they flow. The most plentiful mineral in seawater is sodium chloride, or common salt.

Q. Why do the tides rise and fall?

A. Ocean tides rise (flood) and fall (ebb) about twice every 24 hours. Tides are caused by the gravitational pull of the Sun and Moon on the Earth. They pull the oceans towards them. The land is pulled too but water moves more easily, making a giant wave. As the Earth spins, the wave travels around the Earth, causing the tides.

Q. Where is the deepest point in the oceans?

A. The deepest point in the oceans is the bottom of a deep trench called the Mariana Trench in the Pacific ocean. Measurements of the trench have varied from 11,034 metres to 10,916 metres below the surface.

Q. Where is the continental shelf?

A. In most places, land does not stop suddenly at the coast. It slopes gently away beneath the sea to a depth of about 180 metres. This undersea land is called the continental shelf. At the outer edge of the shelf the steeper continental slope begins, leading down to the deep ocean floor known as the abyss.




ETERNAL BOND





THE RINGED PLANET

Saturn is the sixth planet from the Sun. It is named after the god of agriculture in Roman mythology. Saturn is easily visible through a small telescope, and its famous spectacular rings are quite clear. The astronomer Galileo was the first to see the rings through his telescope.

Saturn is a gas planet, like Jupiter, Neptune, and Uranus. Very little of it is solid. Most of Saturn consists of the elements hydrogen and helium. It is covered with bands of coloured clouds and surrounded by a number of thin rings made up of water ice and ice-covered particles. Photographs taken by the Voyager 1 and 2 spacecraft show that these rings range in size from a speck of dust to the size of a house. Voyager 2 took the photograph you see here.

Because Saturn is made of different substances, different parts of the planet rotate at different rates. The upper atmosphere swirls around the planet at rates of 10 hours and 10 minutes (Earth time) and about 10 hours and 40 minutes. The inner core, which is probably made of hot rocks, rotates in about 10 hours and 39 minutes.

Saturn takes 29 years and 5 months in Earth time to go around the Sun just once. The Earth goes around the Sun once every 365 days. Saturn's year is so much longer because the planet is so much farther away from the Sun than Earth is.

Astronomers have found that at least 30 moons orbit Saturn. The largest of these is Titan, which is almost as large as the planet Mercury or Mars. In our photograph, you can see two of the moons as tiny white spots to the lower left of (Dione) and below (Rhea) the planet. Other satellites include Mimas, Enceladus, and Tethys.

Butterfly Pose

ere's a step-by-step guide on how to do Butterfly Pose (Baddha Konasana):

STARTING Position:

Sit on the floor with your legs extended straight in front of you (Staff Pose or Dandasana).

Bring the Feet Together:

Bend your knees and bring the soles of your feet together, allowing your knees to drop out to the sides.

Hold the Feet:


Hold your feet with your hands. You can grasp your toes with your fingers, or hold onto your ankles or shins, depending on your flexibility.

Lengthen the Spine:

Sit up tall, lengthening your spine. Imagine lifting through the crown of your head to maintain good posture.

Flap the Knees:

Start to gently flap your knees up and down, like the wings of a



Stay Relaxed: Relax your shoulders away from your ears and soften your facial muscles. Allow your hips and groin to open naturally with each breath.

Hold the Pose:

Hold the pose for several breaths, breathing deeply and evenly. You can gently press your elbows against your inner thighs to encourage them to open further.



BUTTERfly Pose (Baddha KONASANA) offers several benefits:

Stretches the Inner Thighs and Groin: By bringing the soles of the feet together and allowing the knees to drop out to the sides, Butterfly Pose stretches the inner thighs (adductors) and groin muscles (hip flexors and abductors).

Opens the Hips:

This pose helps to open and increase flexibility in the hip joints, which can be especially beneficial for individuals who sit for long periods.

IMPROVES Flexibility:

Regular practice of Butterfly Pose gradually increase flexibility in the hips, knees, and groin area, making it easier to perform other yoga poses and activities that require hip flexibility.

Stimulates Abdominal Organs: The gentle compression of the abdomen that comes from folding forward in Butterfly Pose can stimulate the abdominal organs, aiding digestion and potentially relieving digestive discomfort.

Relaxes the Body and Mind: The forward fold in this pose can have a calming effect on the nervous system, promoting relaxation and reducing stress and anxiety.

Mother Teresa

gnes Gonxha Bojaxhiu, who later came to be known as Mother Teresa, was born on August 26, 1910, in Skopje, Macedonia. From a young age, she showed a strong inclination towards charity and helping those in need. At the age of 18, Agnes joined the Sisters of Loreto and began her journey in Ireland to become a nun. In 1929, at the age of 19, Mother Teresa arrived in India and began her work Darjeeling, undergoing training before taking religious vows. Initially, she taught at St. Teresa's School and adopted the name Teresa. Later, she taught and became the headmistress at the Loreto convent school in Calcutta. Mother Teresa founded the Missionaries of Charity in 1950 which organization primarily worked to provide love and care to the poor, the dying, and the marginalized.

Her work spanned a spectrum of humanitarian causes, aiding the poorest, orphans, homeless, AIDS and leprosy patients, disabled individuals, and flood and epidemic victims.

Mother Teresa received numerous awards like the Padma Shree, the Ramón Magsaysay Award, Jawaharlal Nehru



Award for International Understanding and honors, the Bharat Ratna, the Nobel Peace Prize, and many more such national and international awards throughout her lifetime in recognition of her exceptional humanitarian work.

On September 5, 1997, Mother Teresa departed from this world. This day is also celebrated as Mother Teresa's feast day to commemorate her life and the extraordinary service she provided to the poor and needy. Mother Teresa was a very kind caring lady and never once refrained from showing compassion to the one in need. Her work built and impacted lives with no walls based on religion, caste, age, etc and she continues to inspire us till this date. ❖





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
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
